1.0 OIL INDIA LIMITED (OIL), a “Navaratna” Category, Government of India Enterprise, is a premier oil Company engaged in exploration, production and transportation of crude oil & natural gas with its Headquarters at Duliajan, Assam. Rajasthan Field of Oil India Limited (OIL), is engaged in exploration and production of Natural Gas from the Jaisalmer Basin and exploration of Heavy Oil in Bikaner-Nagaur basin of Western Rajasthan in India. The Field Office of OIL at Jodhpur is well connected by Road, Rail & Air.

2.0 In connection with its operations, OIL invites Local Competitive Bids (LCB) from competent and experienced Contractors through OIL’s e-procurement site for **charter hire of six (06) nos. of SRP surface units with allied services for a period of 24 months on call out basis with the provision of extension for another one year or part thereof at same rate, terms and conditions with an option to terminate at OIL’s option.** One complete set of Bid Document covering OIL's IFB for hiring of above services is uploaded in OIL’s e-procurement portal. You are invited to submit your most competitive bid on or before the scheduled bid closing date and time through OIL’s e-procurement portal. 3.0 Integrity Pact : The Integrity Pact must be uploaded in OIL's E-procurement portal along with the Technical Bid digitally signed by the same signatory who signed the Bid i.e. who is duly authorized to sign the Bid. If any bidder refuses to sign Integrity Pact or declines to submit the Integrity Pact, their bid shall be rejected straightway. Uploading the Integrity Pact with digital signature will be construed that all pages of the Integrity Pact has been signed by the bidder's authorized signatory who signs the Bid.

4.0 Goods and Services Tax (GST): The quoted price should be exclusive of GST and the GST as applicable shall be to the Company account. The GST amount on the taxable part of the services provided by the Contractor shall be paid by the

Company as per provisions of the GST Act. Please refer to Annexure – GST and take note of the content before submitting your offer.

5.0 GUIDELINES FOR PARTICIPATING IN OIL’S E-PROCUREMENT:

5.1 To participate in OIL’s E-procurement tender, bidders should have a legally valid digital certificate of Class 3 with Organizations Name and Encryption certificate as per Indian IT Act from the licensed Certifying Authorities operating under the Root Certifying Authority of India (RCAI), Controller of Certifying Authorities (CCA) of India (<http://www.cca.gov.in>). Digital Signature Certificates having “Organization Name” field as “Personal” are not acceptable.

5.2 Bidders without having E-tender Login ID and Password should complete their online registration at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled bid closing date and time of the tender. For online registration, Bidder may visit the OIL’s E-tender site <https://etender.srm.oilindia.in/irj/portal>

5.3 Necessary Login ID & Password will be issued by OIL only after submitting the complete online registration by the Bidder. In the event of late registration/incomplete registration by Bidder, OIL INDIA LIMITED shall not be responsible for late allotment of User ID & Password and request for bid closing date extension on that plea shall not be entertained by Company.

5.4 MSE Units (manufacturers/Service Providers only and not their dealers/distributors) who are already registered with District Industry Centers or Khadi & Village Industries Commission or Khadi & Village Industries Board or Coir Board or National Small Industries Corporation or Directorate of Handicrafts & Handloom or any other body specified by Ministry of MSME are exempted from payment of Bid Security (EMD) irrespective of monetary limit mentioned in their registration, provided they are registered for the item they intend to quote/participate.

5.5 For availing benefits under Public Procurement Policy (Purchase preference & EMD exemption), the interested MSE Bidders must ensure that they are the manufacturer / service provider of tendered item(s) and registered with the appropriate authority for the said item(s). Bids without EMD shall be rejected, if the technical offer does not include a valid copy of relevant MSE Certificate issued by appropriate authority specifying the item as per tender. Therefore, it is in the interest of such MSE Vendors to furnish a copy of complete certificate to the concerned tender handling officer of OIL at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled Bid Closing Date of the tender; seeking clarification/confirmation as to whether their registered item is eligible for EMD exemption or not. Late communication in this regards and request for bid closing date extension on that plea shall not be entertained by Company.

5.6 Parties shall be eligible for accessing the tender in E-portal after OIL enables them in the E-portal on receipt of request for the same.

5.7 Parties, who do not have a User ID, can click on Guest login button in the OIL’s E-portal to view the available open tenders. The detailed guidelines are available in OIL’s e-procurement site (Help Documentation). For any clarification in this regard, Bidders may contact Mr. P. 6.0 PURCHASE PREFERENCE: Purchase Preference will be applicable as per latest Govt. Guidelines. Bidders to take note of the same and quote accordingly. It is the bidder’s responsibility to submit necessary documents from the Competent

Authority to establish that they are eligible for purchase preference against this tender.

7.0 IMPORTANT NOTES:

7.1 Bidders shall take note of the following important points while participating in OIL's e-procurement tender:

i) The bid along with all supporting documents must be submitted through OIL's E-procurement site only except the following documents which shall be submitted manually by the Bidder in two copies in a sealed envelope superscribed with OIL's IFB No., Bid Closing date and marked as "Original Bid Security" and addressed to DGM (C&P), OIL INDIA LTD., Rajasthan Field, 2A, Saraswati Nagar, Jodhpur-342005, Rajasthan (India):

- a) Original Bid Security
- b) Printed catalogue and Literature, if called for in the tender.
- c) Power of Attorney for signing the bid.
- d) Any other document required to be submitted in original as per tender requirement.

The above documents including the Original bid security, must be received at OIL's GM (C&P)'s office at Jodhpur on or before 11.00 Hrs(IST) on the Bid Closing date failing which the bid shall be rejected. A scanned copy of the Bid Security shall also be uploaded by the Bidder along with their Technical Bid in OIL's E-procurement site.

ii) Bid should be submitted online in OIL's E-procurement site before 11.00 AM (IST)(Server Time) of the bid closing date as mentioned and will be opened on the same day at 3.00 PM(IST) at the office of the GM (C&P) in presence of the authorized representatives of the Bidders.

iii) If the digital signature used for signing is not of "Class -3" with Organizations name, the bid will be rejected.

iv) Bidders to note that no price details should be uploaded in "Technical Attachments" Tab Page, otherwise the offer will be rejected. Details of prices as per Price Bid format/Priced bid to be uploaded under "Notes & Attachments" tab. Offer not complying with above submission procedure will be rejected.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1.0 Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of bid. Oil India Limited, hereinafter referred to as Company, will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

A. BID DOCUMENTS

2.0 The services required, bidding procedures and contract terms are prescribed in the Bid Document. This Bid Document includes the following:

2.1 The bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the Bid Documents. Failure to furnish all information required in the Bid Documents or submission of a bid not substantially responsive to the Bid

Documents in every respect will be at the Bidder's risk & responsibility and may result in the rejection of its bid.

3.0 TRANSFERABILITY OF BID DOCUMENTS:

3.1 Bid Documents are non-transferable. Bid can be submitted only in the name of the bidder in whose name the Bid Document has been issued.

3.2 Unsolicited bids will not be considered and will be rejected straightway.

4.0 AMENDMENT OF BID DOCUMENTS:

4.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of bids, the Company may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder, modify the Bid Documents through issuance of an Addendum.

4.2 The Addendum will be uploaded in OIL's E-Tender Portal in the "Technical RFX Response" under the tab "Amendments to Tender Documents". The Company may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for bid submission, if the Bidders are expected to require additional time in which to take the Addendum into account in preparation of their bid or for any other reason. **Bidders are to check from time to time the E-Tender portal ["Technical RFX Response" under the tab "Amendments to Tender Documents"] for any amendments to the bid documents before submission of their bids. No separate intimation shall be sent to the Bidders.**

B. PREPARATION OF BIDS

5.0 LANGUAGE OF BIDS: The bid as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the bid exchanged between the Bidder and the Company shall be in English language, except that any printed literature may be in another language provided it is accompanied by an official and notarised English translated version, which shall govern for the purpose of bid interpretation.

5.1 BIDDER'S/AGENT'S NAME & ADDRESS:

Bidders should indicate in their bids their detailed postal address including the Fax/Telephone /Cell Phone Nos. and E-mail address. Similar information should also be provided in respect of their authorised Agents in India, if any.

6.0 DOCUMENTS COMPRISING THE BID:

Bids are invited under Single Stage Two Bid System. The bid to be uploaded by the Bidder in OIL's E-Tender portal shall comprise of the following components:

(A) TECHNICAL BID

- (i) Complete technical details of the services and equipment specifications with catalogue, etc.
- (ii) Documentary evidence established in accordance with Clause 10.0.
- (iii) Bid Security (scanned) in accordance with Clause 11.0 hereunder. Original Bid Security should be sent as per Clause No. 11.11 below.
- (iv) Copy of Bid-Form **without** indicating prices in Proforma-C
- (v) Statement of Compliance as per Proforma-D

- (vi) Copy of Priced Bid **without** indicating prices(Proforma-B)
- (vii) Integrity Pact digitally signed by OIL's competent personnel as Annexure-A1, attached with the bid document to be digitally signed by the bidder.

(B) PRICED BID

Bidder shall quote their prices online in the following Proforma available in OIL's E-procurement portal in the **"Notes & Attachments" Tab**:

- (i) Price-Bid Format as per Proforma-B
- (ii) Bid Form as per Proforma-C

7.0 BID FORM:

The bidder shall complete the Bid Form and the appropriate Price Schedule furnished in their Bid.

8.0 BID PRICE:

8.1 Prices must be quoted by the Bidders online as per the price bid format available in OIL's E- Tender Portal in "Notes & Attachment" Tab. Unit prices must be quoted by the bidders, both in words and in figures.

8.2 Prices quoted by the successful bidder must remain firm during its performance of the Contract and is not subject to variation on any account.

8.3 All duties and taxes including Corporate Income Tax, Personal Tax, Octroi/Entry Tax, other Cess/levies etc. except Service tax payable by the successful bidder under the Contract for which this Bid Document is being issued, shall be included in the rates, prices and total Bid Price submitted by the bidder, and the evaluation and comparison of bids shall be made accordingly. For example, personal taxes and/or any corporate taxes arising out of the profits on the contract as per rules of the country shall be borne by the bidder.

9.0 CURRENCIES OF BID AND PAYMENT:

9.1As this is a tender involving only Indian bidders (Local Competitive Bidding) the currency of the bid must be in **Indian Rupees** only and payment will be made accordingly in Indian Rupees.

10.0 DOCUMENTS ESTABLISHING BIDDER'S ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS:

10.1 These are listed in **BID EVALUATION CRITERIA (BEC), PART-2** of the Bid document.

11.0 BID SECURITY:

11.1 The Bid Security is required to protect the Company against the risk of Bidder's conduct, which would warrant forfeiture of the Bid Security, pursuant to sub-clause 11.9 hereunder.

11.2 All the bids must be accompanied by Bid Security in Original for the amount as mentioned in the "Forwarding Letter" and shall be denominated in the currency of the Bid, and shall be as per OIL's prescribed format as Bank

Guarantee (BG) enclosed with the NIT vide **Proforma-E** in favour of OIL and payable at Jodhpur, Rajasthan from any of the following Banks –

- (a) Any scheduled Indian Bank or Any Branch of an International bank situated in India and registered with Reserve Bank of India as scheduled foreign bank.
- (b) Bank Guarantee issued by a Scheduled Bank in India at the request of some other Non-Scheduled Bank of India shall not be acceptable.

Note : Bid Security in the form of DD/Cheque/Cashier Cheque or any other mode will not be acceptable.

11.3 Bank Guarantees issued by Banks in India should be on non-judicial stamp paper/Frinking receipt of requisite value, as per Indian Stamp Act, purchased in the name of the Banker or the bidder.

11.4 The Bank Guarantee shall be valid for 90 days beyond the validity of the bids specified in the Bid Document.

11.5 Bank Guarantee with any condition other than those mentioned in OIL's prescribed format shall not be accepted and bids submitted by bidders with such Bank Guarantee will be liable for rejection.

11.6 The Bank Guarantee issued by a Bank amongst others shall contain the complete address of the Bank including Phone Nos., Fax Nos., E-mail address and Branch Code.

11.7 Bid Security shall not accrue any interest during its period of validity or extended validity. OIL shall not be liable to pay any bank charges, commission or interest on the amount of Bid Security.

11.8 The Bank Guarantee should be enforceable at all branches of the issuing Bank within India and preferably at Jodhpur, Rajasthan, the place of issuance of tender.

11.9 Bidders can also submit Bid Security through OIL's on-line Payment Gateway mode. (Note : In case of online submission of Bid Security by bidder, the amount will only be refunded only after adjusting bank charges if any. The bank charges will be to bidder's account. However, the return of Bid Security will be governed by the terms and conditions of the Bid Document.)

11.10 Any bid not secured in accordance with **sub-clause 11.2 or 11.9** above shall be rejected by the Company as non-responsive.

11.11 The bidders shall extend the validity of the Bid Security suitably, if and when specifically advised by OIL, at the bidder's cost.

11.12 Unsuccessful Bidder's Bid Security will be discharged and/or returned within 30 days after finalization of IFB.

11.13 Successful Bidder's Bid Security will be discharged and/or returned upon Bidder's furnishing the Performance Security and signing of the contract. Successful bidder will however ensure validity of the Bid Security till such time the Performance Security in conformity with **Clause 28.0** below is furnished.

11.14 Bid Security shall not accrue any interest during its period of validity or extended validity.

11.15 The Bid Security may be forfeited, if :

- i) The bidder withdraws the bid within its original/extended validity.
- ii) The bidder modifies/revise their bid suo-moto.
- iii) Bidder does not accept the order/contract.
- iv) Bidder does not furnish Performance Security Deposit within the stipulated time as per tender/order/contract.
- v) If it is established that the bidder has submitted fraudulent documents or has indulged into corrupt and fraudulent practice, the bid security shall be forfeited after due process in addition to other action against the bidder

11.16 In case any bidder withdraws their bid during the period of bid validity, Bid Security will be forfeited and the party shall be put in the Holiday List for a period of six(06) months to two(02) years as the case may be as per Company's Banning Policy(available in OIL's website).

11.17 The scanned copy of the original Bid Security in the form of Bank Guarantee must be uploaded by bidder along with the Technical bid in the "Technical Rfx Response" of OIL's E-portal. The original Bid Security shall be submitted by bidder to the office of DGM(C&P), Oil India Ltd., Rajasthan Field, E-Tender No. CJ14318P21

2A-Saraswati Nagar, Basni, Jodhpur-342005, Rajasthan, India in a sealed envelope which must reach the office on or before 11.00 Hrs (IST) of the Bid Closing date. The envelope must be superscribed with "Bid Security", IFB No., Description & Bid Closing Date.

11.18 A bid shall be rejected straightway if Original Bid Security is not received within the stipulated date & time mentioned in the Tender and/or if the Bid Security validity is shorter than the validity indicated in Tender and/or if the Bid Security amount is lesser than the amount indicated in the Tender.

11.19 Bidders are requested to advise the Bank Guarantee issuing bank to comply with the following and ensure to submit, the receipt of the copy of SFMS message as sent by the issuing bank branch, along with the original Bank Guarantee in OIL's tender issuing office / upload the same in OIL's e-tender portal along with the technical bid.

The bank guarantee issued by the bank must be routed through SFMS platform as per following details:

- (b) "MT 760 / MT 767 COV for amendment of bank guarantee

12.0 EXEMPTION FROM SUBMISSION OF BID SECURITY:

12.1 Central Govt. offices and Central Public Sector undertakings are exempted from submitting Bid Security.

12.2 If the bidder is a Micro or Small Enterprises (MSE) registered with District Industry Centres or Khadi and Village Industries Commission or Khadi and Village Industries Board or Coir Board or National Small Industries Corporation or Directorate of Handicrafts and Handloom or any other body specified by Ministry of MSME, then they are also exempted from submitting Bid Security. Bidding MSEs shall have to submit a Copy of valid Registration Certificate clearly indicating the monetary limit, if any and the items for which bidder are registered with any of the aforesaid agencies.

In case bidding MSE is owned by Schedule Caste or Schedule Tribe entrepreneur, valid documentary evidence issued by the agency who has registered the bidder as MSE owned by SC/ST entrepreneur should also be enclosed.

13.0 PERIOD OF VALIDITY OF BIDS:

13.1 Bids shall remain **valid for 120** days from the date of closing of bid prescribed by the Company. **Bids of shorter validity will be rejected as being non-responsive.** If nothing is mentioned by the bidder in their bid about the bid validity, it will be presumed that the bid is valid for 120 days from Bid Closing Date.

13.2 In exceptional circumstances, the Company may solicit the Bidder's consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the response thereto shall be made in writing through Fax or e-mail. The Bid Security provided under Para 11.0 above shall also be suitably extended. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its Bid Security. A Bidder granting the request will neither be required nor permitted to modify their Bid.

14.0 SIGNING OF BID:

14.1 Bids are to be submitted online through OIL's E-procurement portal with digital signature. The bid and all attached documents should be digitally signed by the bidder using "Class 3" digital certificates with Organizations Name [e-commerce application (Certificate with personal verification and Organisation Name)] as per Indian IT Act 2000 obtained from the licensed Certifying Authorities operating under the Root Certifying Authority of India (RCAI), Controller of Certifying Authorities (CCA) of India before bid is uploaded. Digital Signature Certificates having "Organization Name" field other than Bidder's Name are not acceptable. However, aforesaid Digital Signature Certificates having Bidder's Name in the "Organization Name" field are acceptable.

The bid including all uploaded documents shall be digitally signed by duly authorized representative of the bidder holding a Power of Attorney to bind the Bidder to the contract.

If any modifications are made to a document after attaching digital signature, the digital signature shall again be attached to such documents before uploading the same. The Power of Attorney shall be submitted by bidder as mentioned in Para 15.1 below.

The authenticity of above digital signature shall be verified through authorized CA after bid opening and in case the digital signature is not of "Class-3" with organization name, the bid will be rejected.

Bidder is responsible for ensuring the validity of digital signature and its proper usage by their employees.

14.2 The original and all copies of the bid shall be typed or written in indelible inks. Since bids are to be submitted ONLINE with digital signature, manual signature is NOT relevant. The letter of authorisation (as per **Proforma-H**) shall be indicated by written Power of Attorney accompanying the Bid.

14.3 Any person signing the Bid or any other document in respect of this Bidding Document or other relevant documents on behalf of the Bidder without disclosing his authority to do so shall be deemed to have the authority to bind the Bidder. If it is discovered at any time that the person so signing has no authority to do so, the Company (OIL) may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy, cancel his Bid or Contract and hold the Bidder liable to the Company (OIL) for all costs and damages arising from the cancellation of the Bid or Contract including any loss which the Company (OIL) may sustain on account thereof.

14.4 Any physical documents submitted by bidders shall contain no interlineations, white fluid erasures or overwriting except as necessary to correct

errors made by the Bidder, in which case such correction shall be initialled by the person or persons who has/have digitally signed the Bid.

14.5 Any Bid, which is incomplete, ambiguous, or not in compliance with the Bidding process will be rejected.

15.0 SUBMISSION OF BIDS

15.1 The tender is processed under Single Stage TwoBid System. Bidder shall submit the Technical bid and Priced bid along with all the Annexure and Proforma (wherever applicable) and copies of documents in electronic form through OIL's e-procurement portal within the Bid Closing Date & Time stipulated in the e-tender. For submission of Bids online at OIL's E-Tender Portal, detailed instructions is available in "**HELP DOCUMENTATION**" available in OIL's E-Tender Portal. Guidelines for bid submission are also provided in the "Forwarding Letter". The Technical Bid is to be submitted as per Terms of Reference/Technical Specifications of the bid document and Priced Bid as per the Price Schedule. The Technical Bid should be uploaded in the "Technical RFX Response" under "Techno-Commercial Bid" Tab Page only. Prices to be quoted as per Proforma-B should be uploaded as Attachment just below the "Tendering Text" in the attachment link under "Techno-Commercial Bid" Tab under General Data in the e-portal. **No price should be given in the "Technical RFX Response", otherwise bid shall be rejected.** The priced bid should not be submitted in physical form and which shall not be considered.

However, the following documents in one set should necessarily be submitted in physical form in sealed envelope super-scribing the "IFB No., Brief Description of services and Bid Closing/Opening date & Time along with the bidder's name" and should be submitted to Chief Manager(C&P), Oil India Ltd., Rajasthan Field, 2A-Saraswati Nagar, Jodhpur-342005, Rajasthan, India on or before 11.00 Hrs(IST) on the bid closing date indicated in the IFB :

- i) The Original Bid Security along with 2 sets of photocopy
- ii) Power of Attorney for signing of the bid digitally
- iii) Any other document required to be submitted in original as per bid document requirement.
- iv) Printed catalogue and literature if called for in the bid document.

Documents sent through E-mail/Fax/Telephonic method will not be considered.

15.2 All the conditions of the contract to be made with the successful bidder are given in various Sections of the Bid Document. Bidders are requested to state their compliance to each clause as per **Proforma-D** of the bid document and in case of non-compliance, if any, the same to be highlighted in the Proforma - D and the same should be uploaded along with the Technical Bid.

15.3 Timely delivery of the documents in physical form as stated in Para 15.1 above is the responsibility of the bidder. Bidders should send the same through Registered Post or by Courier Services or by hand delivery to the Officer in Charge of the particular tender before the Bid Closing Date and Time. Company shall not be responsible for any postal delay/transit loss.

15.4 Bids received through the e-procurement portal shall only be accepted. Bids received in any other form shall not be accepted.

16.0 DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF BIDS:

16.1 Bids should be submitted online as per the online tender submission deadline. Bidders will not be permitted by System to make any changes in their bid/quote after the bid submission deadline is reached.

16.2 No bid can be submitted after the submission dead line is reached. The system time displayed on the e-procurement web page shall decide the submission dead line.

16.3 The documents in physical form as stated in Para 15.1 must be received by Company at the address specified in the "Forwarding Letter" on or before 11.00 Hrs(IST) on the Bid Closing Date mentioned in the "Forwarding Letter". Timely delivery of the same at the address mentioned in the Forwarding Letter is the responsibility of the Bidders.

17.0 LATE BIDS: Bidders are advised in their own interest to ensure that their bids are uploaded in system before the closing date and time of the bid. The documents in physical form mainly the Original Bid Security if received by the Company after the deadline for submission prescribed by the Company shall be rejected and shall be returned to the Bidders in unopened condition immediately.

18.0 MODIFICATION AND WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS:

18.1 The Bidder after submission of Bid may modify or withdraw its Bid prior to Bid Closing Date & Time.

18.2 No Bid can be modified or withdrawn subsequent to the deadline for submission of Bids.

18.3 No Bid can be withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submission of Bids and the expiry of the period of Bid Validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Form. Withdrawal of a Bid during this interval shall result in the Bidder's forfeiture of its Bid Security and bidder shall also be put in the Holiday List for a period varying from six(06) months to two(02) years as the case may be as per Company's Banning Policy.

19.0 EXTENSION OF BID SUBMISSION DATE:

Normally no request for extension of Bid Closing Date & Time will be entertained. However, OIL at its discretion, may extend the Bid Closing Date and/or Time due to any reasons.

20.0 BID OPENING AND EVALUATION:

20.1 Company will open the Technical Bids, including submission made pursuant to clause 19.0, in presence of Bidder's representatives who choose to attend at the date, time and place mentioned in the Forwarding Letter. However, an authorisation letter (as per **Proforma-I**) from the Bidder must be produced by the Bidder's representative at the time of Bid Opening. Unless this Letter is presented, the representative will not be allowed to attend the Bid Opening. The Bidder's representatives who are allowed to attend the Bid Opening shall sign a

register evidencing their attendance. Only one representative against each Bid will be allowed to attend. In technical bid opening, only “Technical RFx Response” will be opened. Bidders therefore should ensure that technical bid is uploaded in the “Technical RFx Response” Tab Page only in the E-portal.

20.2 In case of any unscheduled holiday or Bandh on the Bid Opening Date, the Bids will be opened on the next full working day. Accordingly, Bid Closing Date / time will get extended up to the next working day and time.

20.3 Bids which have been withdrawn pursuant to clause 19.0 shall not be opened. Company will examine bids to determine whether they are complete, whether requisite Bid Securities have been furnished, whether documents have been digitally signed and whether the bids are generally in order.

20.4 At bid opening, Company will announce the Bidder's names, written notifications of bid modifications or withdrawal, if any, the presence of requisite Bid Security, and such other details as the Company may consider appropriate.

20.5 Normally no clarifications shall be sought from the Bidders. However, for assisting in the evaluation of the bids especially on the issues where the Bidder confirms compliance in the evaluation and contradiction exists on the same issues due to lack of required supporting documents in the Bid (i.e. document is deficient or missing), or due to some statement at other place of the Bid (i.e. reconfirmation of confirmation) or vice versa, clarifications may be sought by OIL. In all the above situations, the Bidder will not be allowed to change the basic structure of the Bid already submitted by them and no change in the price or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered or permitted.

20.6 Prior to the detailed evaluation, Company will determine the substantial responsiveness of each bid to the requirement of the Bid Documents. For purpose of these paragraphs, a substantially responsive bid is one, which conforms to all the terms and conditions of the Bid Document without material deviations or reservation. A material deviation or reservation is one which affects in any way substantial way the scope, quality, or performance of work, or which limits in any substantial way, in-consistent way with the Bid Documents, the Company's right or the bidder's obligations under the contract, and the rectification of which deviation or reservation would affect unfairly the competitive position of other bidders presenting substantial responsive bids. The Company's determination of Bid's responsiveness is to be based on the contents of the Bid itself without recourse to extrinsic evidence.

20.7 A Bid determined as not substantially responsive will be rejected by the Company and may not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the non-conformity.

20.8 The Company may waive minor informality or nonconformity or irregularity in a Bid, which does not constitute a material deviation, provided such waiver, does not prejudice or affect the relative ranking of any Bidder.

21.0 OPENING OF PRICED BIDS:

21.1 Company will open the Priced Bids of the technically qualified Bidders on a specific date in presence of representatives of the qualified bidders. The technically qualified Bidders will be intimated about the Priced Bid Opening Date & Time in advance. In case of any unscheduled holiday or Bandh on the Priced Bid Opening Date, the Bids will be opened on the next working day.

21.2 The Company will examine the Price quoted by Bidders to determine whether they are complete, any computational errors have been made, the documents have been properly signed, and the bids are generally in order.

21.3 Arithmetical errors will be rectified on the following basis. If there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price (that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity) the unit price shall prevail and the total price shall be corrected accordingly. If there is a discrepancy between words, and figures, the amount in words will prevail. If any Bidder does not accept the correction of the errors, their Bid will be rejected.

22.0 EVALUATION AND COMPARISON OF BIDS:

The Company will evaluate and compare the bids as per **BID EVALUATION CRITERIA (BEC), PART-2** of the Bid Document.

23.0 DISCOUNTS / REBATES:

Unconditional discounts/rebates, if any, given in the bid will be considered for evaluation.

23.1 Post bid or conditional discounts/rebates offered by any bidder shall not be considered for evaluation of bids. However, if the lowest bidder happens to be the final acceptable bidder for award of contract, and if they have offered any discounts/rebates, the contract shall be awarded after taking into account such discounts/rebates.

24.0 CONTACTING THE COMPANY:

24.1 Except as otherwise provided in **Clause 20.0** above, no Bidder shall contact Company on any matter relating to its bid, from the time of the bid opening to the time the Contract is awarded except as required by Company vide **sub-clause 20.6**.

24.2 An effort by a Bidder to influence the Company in the Company's bid evaluation, bid comparison or Contract award decisions may result in the rejection of their bid.

25.0 AWARD OF CONTRACT

25.1 AWARD CRITERIA:

The Company will award the Contract to the successful Bidder whose bid has been determined to be substantially responsive and has been determined as the lowest evaluated bid, provided further that the Bidder is determined to be qualified to perform the Contract satisfactorily.

26.0 COMPANY'S RIGHT TO ACCEPT OR REJECT ANY BID:

Company reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids and to annul the bidding process and reject all bids, at any time prior to award of contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder, or bidders or any obligation to inform the affected bidder of the grounds for Company's action.

27.0 NOTIFICATION OF AWARD:

27.1 Prior to the expiry of the period of bid validity or extended validity, Company will notify the successful Bidder in writing by registered letter or by fax or E-mail (to be confirmed in writing by registered / couriered letter) that its Bid has been accepted.

27.2 The notification of award will constitute the formation of the Contract.

27.3 Upon the successful Bidder's furnishing of Performance Security pursuant to Clause 28.0 below, the Company will promptly notify each un-successful Bidder and will discharge their Bid Security, pursuant to Clause 11.0 hereinabove.

28.0 PERFORMANCE SECURITY:

28.1 On receipt of notification of award from the Company, the successful Bidder shall furnish to Company the Performance Security for an amount specified in the Letter of Award (LOA) issued by Company to Contractor awarding the contract) as per **Proforma-F** and must be in the form of a Bank Guarantee from:

a) Any schedule Indian Bank or Any Branch of an International bank situated in India and registered with Reserve Bank of India as scheduled foreign bank ,

Bank Guarantee issued by a Bank, amongst others, must contain the following particulars of such bank:

- a) Full address.
- b) Branch Code.
- c) Code Nos. of the authorized signatory with full name and designation.
- d) Phone Nos., Fax Nos., E-mail address.

The domestic bidders will have to submit the Bank Guarantee from any of the scheduled banks and on non-judicial stamp paper of requisite value as per the Indian Stamp Act, purchased in the name of the issuing banker.

The Performance Security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract.

28.2 The Performance Security specified above must be valid for 3 (three) months beyond the contract period. The Performance Security will be discharged by Company not later than 30 days following its expiry. In the event of any extension of the Contract period, Bank Guarantee should be extended by Contractor by the period equivalent to the extended period.

28.3 The Performance Security shall be payable to Company as compensation for any loss resulting from Contractor's failure to fulfil its obligations under the Contract.

28.4 The Performance Security will not accrue any interest during its period of validity or extended validity.

28.5 Failure of the successful Bidder to comply with the requirements of **clause 28.0 and/or 29.0** shall constitute sufficient grounds for annulment of the award and forfeiture of the Bid Security or Performance Security. In such an eventuality, the party shall be put in the Holiday List for a period varying from six(06) months to two (02) years as the case may be as per Company's Banning Policy.

28.6 Bidders are requested to advise the Bank Guarantee issuing bank to comply with the following and ensure to submit, the receipt of the copy of SFMS message as sent by the issuing bank branch, along with the original Bank Guarantee in OIL's tender issuing office / upload the same in OIL's e-tender portal along with the technical bid.

The bank guarantee issued by the bank must be routed through SFMS platform as per following details:

- (a) "MT 760 / MT 760 COV for issuance of bank guarantee
- (b) "MT 760 / MT 767 COV for amendment of bank guarantee

The above message/intimation shall be sent through SFMS by the BG issuing bank branch to Axis Bank, Jodhpur Branch, IFS Code - UTIB0000057; Swift Code: AXISINBB057. Branch Address - AXIS Bank Ltd, Prince Tower, Near Jaljog Circle, Residency Road, Jodhpur - 342003"

29.0 SIGNING OF CONTRACT:

29.1 At the same time as the Company notifies the successful Bidder that its Bid has been accepted, the Company will either call the successful Bidder for signing of the agreement or send the Contract Form provided in the Bid Documents, along with the General & Special Conditions of Contract, Technical Specifications, Schedule of Rates incorporating all agreements agreed between the two parties.

29.2 The successful Bidder shall sign and date the contract and return it to the Company after receipt of LOA. Till the contract is signed, the LOA issued to the successful bidder shall remain binding amongst the two parties.

29.3 In the event of failure on the part of the successful Bidder to sign the contract, OIL reserves the right to terminate the LOA issued to the successful Bidder and invoke the Bid Security or the Performance Security if submitted by the successful Bidder. The party shall also be put in the Holiday List for a period varying from six (06) months to two (02) years as the case may be as per Company's Banning Policy.

30.0 FURNISHING FRAUDULENT INFORMATION/DOCUMENTS:

If it is found that a bidder/contractor has furnished fraudulent information / documents, the Bid Security/Performance Security shall be forfeited and the party shall be banned for a period of 3 (three) years from the date of detection of such fraudulent act besides the legal action as per Company's Banning Policy. In case of major and serious fraud, period of debarment may be enhanced.

31.0 CREDIT FACILITY:

Bidders should indicate clearly in the Bid about availability of any credit facility inclusive of Government to Government credits indicating the applicable terms and conditions of such credit.

32.0 MOBILISATION ADVANCE PAYMENT:

32.1 Request for advance payment shall not be normally considered. However, depending on the merit and at the discretion of the Company, advance against mobilisation charge may be given at an interest rate of 1% above the prevailing Bank rate (CC rate) of SBI from the date of payment of the advance till recovery/refund.

32.2 Advance payment agreed to by the Company shall be paid only against submission of an acceptable bank guarantee whose value should be equivalent to the amount of advance plus the amount of interest covering the period of advance. Bank guarantee shall be valid for 2 months beyond completion of mobilisation and the same may be invoked in the event of Contractor's failure to mobilise as per agreement.

32.3 In the event of any extension to the mobilisation period, Contractor shall have to enhance the value of the bank guarantee to cover the interest for the extended period and also to extend the validity of bank guarantee accordingly.

33.0 INTEGRITY PACT:

33.1 OIL shall be entering into an Integrity Pact with the Bidders as per format enclosed vide **Annexure-A1** of the Bid Document. The Integrity Pact has been duly signed digitally by OIL's competent signatory and uploaded in the OIL's e-portal. The Integrity Pact shall be returned by the bidder (along with the technical Bid) duly signed by the same signatory who signed the Bid i.e. who is duly authorized to sign the Bid. Uploading the Integrity Pact in the OIL's E-portal with digital signature will be construed that all pages of the Integrity Pact has been signed by the bidder's authorized signatory who has signed the bid. **If any bidder refuses to sign Integrity Pact or declines to submit the Integrity Pact, their bid shall be rejected straightway.**

33.2 OIL has appointed the following three persons as Independent External Monitors (IEM) for a period of 3(three) years to oversee implementation of Integrity Pact in OIL. Bidders may contact the Independent External Monitor for any matter relating to the IFB at the following addresses:

34.0 LOCAL CONDITIONS:

It is imperative for each Bidder to be fully informed themselves of all Indian as well as local conditions, factors and legislation which may have any effect on the execution of the work covered under the Bidding Document. The bidders shall be deemed, prior to submitting their bids to have satisfied themselves of all the

aspects covering the nature of the work as stipulated in the Bidding Document and obtain for themselves all necessary information as to the risks, contingencies and all other circumstances, which may influence or affect the various obligations under the Contract.

No request will be considered for clarifications from the Company (OIL) regarding such conditions, factors and legislation. It is understood and agreed that such conditions, factors and legislation have been properly investigated and considered by the Bidders while submitting the Bids. Failure to do so shall not relieve the Bidders from responsibility to estimate properly the cost of performing the work within the provided timeframe. Company (OIL) will assume no responsibility for any understandings or representations concerning conditions made by any of their officers prior to award of the Contract. Company (OIL) shall not permit any Changes to the time schedule of the Contract or any financial adjustments arising from the Bidder's lack of knowledge and its effect on the cost of execution of the Contract.

35.0 SPECIFICATIONS: Before submission of Bids, Bidders are requested to make themselves fully conversant with all Conditions of the Bid Document and other relevant information related to the works/services to be executed under the Contract.

36.0 PURCHASE PREFERENCE : Purchase Preference will be applicable as per latest Govt. Guidelines. Bidders to take note of the same and quote accordingly. It is Bidder's responsibility to submit necessary documents from the Competent Authority to establish that they are eligible for purchase preference against this tender.

37.0 PRICE PREFERENCE : Not applicable.

38.0 PURCHASE PREFERENCE ON LOCAL CONTENT: Purchase preference policy-linked with Local Content (PP - LC) notified vide letter no. O-27011/44/2015-ONG-II/FP dated 25.04.2017 of MoP&NG shall be applicable in this tender. Bidders seeking benefits, under Purchase Preference Policy (linked with Local Content) (PP-LC) shall have to comply with all the provisions specified in **Annexure- X** and shall have to submit all undertakings / documents applicable for this policy.

39.0 General Health, Safety and Environment (HSE) aspects will be as per the terms set forth in Appendix-A of the tender document.

40.0 Procedure for obtaining Labour License under Contract Labour (R&A) Act, 1970 & Central Rules-1971 will as per terms set forth in Appendix-B of tender document.

41.0 The User Manual provided on the e-portal on the procedure How to create Response for submitting offer may be referred for guidance.

BID EVALUATION CRITERIA (BEC)

The Bid shall conform generally to the specifications and terms and conditions including the scope of work/supply given in the bidding document. Bids will be rejected in case services offered do not conform to the required parameters stipulated in the technical specifications/scope of work/terms of reference. Notwithstanding the general conformity of the bid to the stipulated specifications/terms, the following requirements will have to be particularly met by the bidders without which the same will be considered as non-responsive and rejected.

1. TECHNICAL

1.1 The bidder shall be in the business of providing/ having experience of providing services of Mobile SRP surface unit along with operation and maintenance service to any E&P company during last seven (07) years preceding from the original bid closing date of this tender.

1.1.1 The bidder must have successfully carried out at least one such contract for supply, installation, Operation & Maintenance of minimum three (03) nos. of SRP surface unit, on charter hire basis, anywhere in the world in the last 7 years preceding from the original bid closing date of this tender. Documentary evidence confirming their experience as above must be submitted along with the technical bid, failing which the offer will be rejected.

These documents should be in the form of duly attested copies of relevant pages of contracts/work orders/completion certificates/Final payment certificates etc. issued by clients.

1.2 Bidder should be able to provide services of adequately qualified and trained/experienced key-manpower as specified in the Scope of work for operation and maintenance of the SRP units. Technical bid should include confirmation by the bidder that they will provide required personnel to be deployed along with the unit for its operation, failing which the offer will not be accepted.

1.3 Bidder shall certify that accommodation and food at site for the contractor personnel will be the responsibility of the contractor.

1.4 Bids which do not include all the jobs/services mentioned in the tender document will be considered as incomplete and rejected.

1.5 Bidder to confirm mobilization of the equipment and manpower within 15 days from issue of initial mobilization notice by OIL and for subsequent mobilization within 7 days from issue of initial mobilization notice by OIL.

1.6 Bidder has to confirm that the vintage of all units should be less than five years till 01.01.2020. Documentary evidence in this regard needs to be provided.

1.7 DOCUMENTS:

Bidders must furnish documentary evidences, in support of fulfilling all above requirement as under along with the Technical Bid:

- a) Copies of relevant pages of Contracts & Completion Certificate issued by the clients in support to establish successful execution as per 1.1 must be submitted along with the technical bid. These documents should be in the form of duly attested copies of relevant pages of contracts/work orders/completion certificates/Final payment certificates etc. issued by clients.
- b) Details of personnel proposed to be deployed for the operation and maintenance of the SRP Unit.
- c) All documents submitted with bid must be self-certified by the bidder's authorized person signing the bid. However, OIL reserves the right to ask for submission of any Original document for verification at any point of time.

NOTES: Required Certificates/Confirmation document as indicated above should be submitted along with the un-priced Technical bid; absence of which will render the offers Non responsive.

2.0 FINANCIAL CRITERIA:

2.1 Annual financial turnover of the bidder during any of preceding three financial / accounting years from the original bid closing date should be at least INR 2.75 Crores.

2.2 Net Worth of the bidder must be positive for preceding financial / accounting year.

Considering the time required for preparation of financial statements, if the last date of preceding financial / accounting year falls within the preceding six months reckoned from the original bid closing date and the financial statements of the preceding financial / accounting year are not available with the bidder, then the financial turnover of the previous three financial / accounting years excluding the preceding financial / accounting year will be considered. In such cases, the Net Wirth of the previous year financial / accounting year excluding the preceding financial / accounting year will be considered. However, the bidder has to submit an affidavit / Undertaking certifying that "the balance sheet / financial statements for the financial year _____ has actually not been audited so far"

Notes :

(a) For proof of Annual Turnover & Net worth any one of the following document must be submitted along with the bid:-

i) A certificate issued by a practicing Chartered Cost Accountant (with Membership Number and Firm Registration Number), certifying the Annual turnover & Net worth as per format prescribed in ANNEXURE - B.

OR

ii) Audited Balance Sheet along with Profit & Loss account. In case of foreign bidders, self-attested/ digitally signed printed published accounts are also acceptable.

b) In case the bidder is a Central Govt. Organization/PSU/State Govt. Organization/Semi-State Govt. Organization or any other Central/State Govt. Undertaking, where the auditor is appointed only after the approval of Comptroller and Auditor General of India and the Central Government, their certificates may be accepted even though FRN is not available. However, bidder to provide documentary evidence for the same.

3.0 **COMMERCIAL CRITERIA** :

The following vital commercial criteria should be strictly complied with failing which the bid will be rejected:

3.1 Bids shall be submitted under single stage two bid system i.e. Technical Bid and Priced Bid separately. Bids shall be rejected outright if the prices are indicated in the technical bids or if not conforming to this two bid system.

3.2 Bidder shall offer firm prices. Price quoted by the successful bidder must remain firm during the execution of the contract and not subject to variation on any account.

3.3 Bids with shorter validity i.e. less than **120 days** from the bid closing date shall be rejected as being non-responsive.

3.4 Bid Security in Original shall be furnished as a part of the Technical Bid and shall reach OIL's office at Jodhpur before bid closing date & time. A scanned copy of the bid security shall however be uploaded in OIL's E-Procurement portal along with the Technical Bid. The amount of Bid Security shall be as specified in the Forwarding Letter of the Bid Document. Bid without proper & valid Bid Security shall be rejected.

3.5 The Integrity Pact must be uploaded in OIL's E-Procurement portal along with the Technical Bid duly signed by the same signatory who signed the Bid i.e. who is duly authorized to sign the Bid. If any bidder refuses to sign Integrity Pact or declines to submit the Integrity Pact, their bid shall be rejected straightway.

3.6 Bids received through the e-procurement portal shall only be accepted. Bids received in any other form shall not be accepted.

3.7 Bids submitted after the Bid Closing Date and Time shall be rejected.

3.8 The bid documents are not transferable. Bids made by bidders who have not been issued the Bid documents from the Company shall be rejected.

3.9 Bids shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be digitally signed by the bidder or his authorized representative.

3.10 Bids shall contain no interlineations, erasures or over writing except as necessary to correct errors made by bidders, in which case such corrections shall be initialed by the person(s) signing the Bid.

3.11 Bidders shall bear, within the quoted rates, the personal tax as applicable in respect of their personnel and Sub-Contractor's personnel, arising out of execution of the contract.

3.12 Bidders shall bear, within the quoted rate, the corporate tax as applicable on the income from the contract.

3.13 Bidders shall quote their price exclusive of GST. The GST amount on the taxable part of the goods/services provided by the Contractor shall be paid by the Company as per provisions of the GST Act.

3.14 Any Bid containing false statement shall be rejected.

3.15 Bidders must quote clearly and strictly in accordance with the price schedule outlined in "Price Bid Format" (Proforma – B) of Bid Document; otherwise the Bid will be summarily rejected.

3.16 Bidder must accept and comply with the following clauses as given in the Bid Document in toto failing which bid will be rejected –

- i) Performance Guarantee Clause
- ii) Force Majeure Clause
- iii) Tax Liabilities Clause
- iv) Arbitration Clause
- v) Acceptance of Jurisdiction and Applicable Law
- vi) Liquidated damage and penalty clause
- vii) Safety & Labor Law
- viii) Termination Clause
- ix) Integrity Pact
- x) Withholding Clause

4.0 **GENERAL**

4.1 The Statement of Compliance (enclosed PROFORMA – D) should be digitally signed and uploaded along with the Technical Bid (un-priced). In case bidder takes exception to any clause of Tender Document not covered under BEC, then the Company has the discretion to load or reject the offer on account of such exception if the Bidder does not withdraw/modify the deviation when/as advised by the Company. The loading so done by the Company will be final and binding on the Bidders.

4.2 To ascertain the substantial responsiveness of the Bid the Company reserves the right to ask the Bidder for clarification in respect of clauses covered under BEC also and such clarifications fulfilling the BEC clauses in totality must be received on or before the deadline given by the Company, failing which the offer will be summarily rejected.

4.3 Any exception or deviation to the Tender requirements must be tabulated in PROFORMA-D of this Section by the Bidder in their Technical Bid only. Any additional information, terms or conditions included in the Commercial (Priced) Bid will not be considered by OIL for evaluation of the Tender.

4.4 The Company reserves the right to cancel/withdraw the tender or annul the bidding process at any time prior to award of contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the bidders or any obligation to inform the bidders of the grounds of Company's action.

4.5 If any clauses in the BEC contradict clauses elsewhere in the Bid Document, then the clauses in the BEC shall prevail.

BID EVALUATION CRITERIA:

The bids conforming to the technical specifications, terms and conditions stipulated in the bidding document and considered to be responsive after subjecting to Bid Evaluation Criteria will be considered for further evaluation as per the Bid Evaluation Criteria given below:

1.0 Commercial Bids (price-bids) of only the technically qualified Bidders will be opened on a pre-determined date and the same will be evaluated taking in to account the sum total cost of all components quoted by the Bidders as per Price Bid Format (Proforma-B) and the contract will be awarded to the lowest evaluated Bidder.

2.0 If there is any discrepancy between the unit price and total price, the unit price will prevail and total price shall be corrected. Similarly, if there is any discrepancy between words and figure, the amount in words shall prevail and will be adopted for evaluation.

3.0 The Bidders must quote their charges/ rates in Indian Rupee and in the manner as called for vide "Schedule of Rates" under Part-3, Section-IV and the summarized Price Bid Format vide enclosed Proforma-B.

4.0 The contract will be signed with successful Bidder for Two (02) years of operation initially with a provision for extension by another one (01) year or part thereof. Depending on the performance of the Contractor, the Company reserves the right to extend the contract for another one (01) year or part thereof at the same rates, terms and conditions at the discretion of the Company. However, Bids will be evaluated on total cost for two (02) years of operation only.

5.0 The quantities shown against each item in the "**Price Bid Format (i.e. in Proforma-B)**" shall be considered for the purpose of Bid Evaluation. It is, however, to be clearly understood that the assumptions made in respect of the number of days/parameters for various operations for a period of two years are only for the purpose of evaluation of the bid and the bidder will be paid on the basis of the actual number of days/parameter, as the case may be.

6.0 To ascertain the inter-se-ranking, the comparison of the responsive bids will be made subject to loading for any deviation. Commercial Bids shall be evaluated taking into account the rates quoted in the PRICE BID FORMAT as per Proforma - B.

SECTION-I

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1.0 DEFINITIONS:

1.1 In the contract, the following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

(a) "The Contract" means agreement entered into between Company and Contractor, as recorded in the contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein;

(b) "The Contract Price" means the price payable to Contractor under the contract for the full and proper performance of its contractual obligations;

(c) "Company" or "OIL" means Oil India Limited;

(d) "Contractor" means the Contractor performing the work under this Contract.

(e) "Contractor's Personnel" means the personnel to be provided by the Contractor to provide services as per the contract.

(f) "Company's Personnel" means the personnel to be provided by OIL or OIL's Contractor (other than the Contractor executing the Contract). The Company representatives of OIL are also included in the Company's personnel.

(g) "Contractor's items" means the equipment, materials and services, which are to be provided by Contractor or to be provided by Company at the expense of the Contractor, which are listed in Tender Document under Terms of Reference and Technical Specifications.

(h) "Company's items" means the equipment, materials and services, which are to be provided by Company at the expense of Company and listed in the Contract.

(i) "Company Representative" means the person or persons appointed and approved from time to time by the Company to act on its behalf for overall coordination and project management purpose.

(j) "The Work" means each and every activity required for the successful performance of the services described in Section II, the Terms of Reference.

(k) "Day" means a calendar day of twenty-four (24) consecutive hours beginning at 06:00 hrs. and ending at 06:00 hrs.

(l) "Party" means either the Company or Contractor as the context so permits and, as expressed in the plural, shall mean the Company and Contractor collectively.

(m) "Site" means the land and other places, on/under/ in or through which the works are to be executed by the Contractor and any other land and places provided by the Company for working space or any other purpose as designated hereinafter as forming part of the Site.

(n) "Gross Negligence" means any act or failure to act (whether sole, joint or concurrent) by a person or entity which was intended to cause, or which was in reckless disregard of or wanton indifference to, avoidable and harmful consequences such person or entity knew, or should have known, would result from such act or failure to act. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Gross negligence shall not include any action taken in good faith for the safeguard of life or property.

(o) "Willful Misconduct" means intentional disregard of good and prudent standards of performance or proper conduct under the Contract with knowledge that it is likely to result in any injury to any person or persons or loss or damage of property.

(p) "Affiliate" means any Person which Controls, or is Controlled by, or under common Control with a Party; "Control" in this context means ownership of more than fifty percent (50%) of the shares of a Person and/or the right to appoint majority directors on Board by contract or otherwise.

(q) "Co-venturers" shall mean any co-venturers with the Company from time to time having an interest in either the PSC and/or a Joint and/or associated contracts for the purposes of exploration and production in Operating Contract the Operating Area and on whose behalf the Company would be deemed to have entered into this Contract.

2.0 EFFECTIVE DATE, MOBILISATION TIME/DE-MOBILIZATION TIME, DATE OF COMMENCEMENT OF THE CONTRACT AND DURATION OF CONTRACT:

2.1 EFFECTIVE DATE OF CONTRACT : The contract shall become effective as of the date Company notifies the Contractor in writing that it has been awarded the contract. This date of issuance of Letter of Award(LOA) by the Company will be the Effective Date of Contract.

3.2 MOBILISATION/De- MOBILISATION TIME OF THE CONTRACT: As and when the requirement of SRP Surface Unit Services as provisioned in the contract comes up, Company will issue advance notice to the Contractor giving clear fifteen (15) days time for the initial i.e., the 1st time mobilization and seven (07) days time for the subsequent mobilizations to mobilize their tools, equipment and personnel to take up the jobs accordingly at the designated site. The Contractor then immediately on receipt of such mobilisation notice will mobilise the resources up to the site as requisitioned within seven (07) days (including the journey time). On completion of the site jobs in consistence with the requisition from Company, the Contractor will demobilize their resources from site to their base. All related costs towards the mobilisation and demobilization as above will be entirely borne by the Contractor and the rates to be quoted accordingly. Also, food, accommodation and preliminary medical facilities etc. as required for

Contractor's Crew at well site during the job execution will be the sole responsibility of the Contractor.

2.3 DATE OF COMMENCEMENT OF CONTRACT: The date on which the first mobilization on call out basis is completed in all respects will be treated as date of Commencement of Contract.

2.4 DURATION OF CONTRACT: The contract shall be valid for a period of Two (02) years from the Date of Commencement of the Contract with an option to extend the contract period for another One (01) year or part thereof at the discretion of Company at the same rates, terms and conditions. The terms and conditions shall continue until the completion/abandonment of the last call out job where the individual tools/equipments are being deployed nearer the time of the expiry of the Contract or any extension thereof.

3.0 GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF CONTRACTOR : Contractor shall, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions of this Contract:

3.1 Perform the work described in the Terms of Reference (Part-3, Section-II) in most economic and cost effective way.

3.2 Except as otherwise provided in the Terms of Reference and the special Conditions of the contract, provide all labour as required to perform the work.

3.3 Perform all other obligations, work and services which are required by the terms of this contract or which reasonably can be implied from such terms as being necessary for the successful and timely completion of the work.

3.4 Contractor shall be deemed to have satisfied himself before submitting their bid as to the correctness and sufficiency of its bid for the services required and of the rates and prices quoted, which rates and prices shall, except insofar as otherwise provided, cover all its obligations under the contract.

3.5 Contractor shall give or provide all necessary supervision during the performance of the services and as long thereafter within the warranty period as Company may consider necessary for the proper fulfilling of contractor's obligations under the contract.

4.0 GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE COMPANY: Company shall, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions of this contract:

4.1 Pay Contractor in accordance with terms and conditions of the contract. The period of time for which each rate shall be applicable shall be computed from and to the nearest an hour. The rates contained in the Contract shall be based on Contractor's operation being conducted on a seven (07) days week and a twenty-four (24) hours work day. Under the Contract, Contractor will be entitled to the applicable rate defined in PROFORMA -B. These rates are payable when the required condition has existed for a full 24 hours period. If the required condition existed for less than 24 hours then payments shall be made on pro-rata basis.

4.2 Allow Contractor access, subject to normal security and safety procedures, to all areas as required for orderly performance of the work.

4.3 Perform all other obligations required of Company by the terms of this contract.

5.0 PERSONNEL TO BE DEPLOYED BY CONTRACTOR

5.1 Contractor warrants that it shall provide competent, qualified and sufficiently experienced personnel to perform the work correctly and efficiently.

5.2 The Contractor should ensure that their personnel observe applicable company and statutory safety requirement. Upon Company's written request, contractor, entirely at its own expense, shall remove immediately any personnel of the Contractor determined by the Company to be unsuitable and shall promptly replace such personnel with personnel acceptable to the Company. Replacement personnel should be mobilized within 15 days from the date of issuance of notice without affecting the operation of the company.

5.3 The Contractor shall be solely responsible throughout the period of the contract for providing all requirements of their personnel including but not limited to, their transportation to & fro from field/drilling site, enroute/ local boarding, lodging & medical attention etc. Company shall have no responsibility or liability in this regard.

5.4 Contractor's key personnel shall be fluent in English language (both writing and speaking).

6.0 WARRANTY AND REMEDY OF DEFECTS

6.1 Contractor warrants that it shall perform the work in a professional manner and in accordance with their highest degree of quality, efficiency, and with the state of the art technology/inspection services and in conformity with all specifications, standards and drawings set forth or referred to in the Technical Specifications. They should comply with the instructions and guidance, which Company may give to the Contractor from time to time.

6.2 Should Company discover at any time during the tenure of the Contract or till the Unit/equipment/tools are demobilised from site or base camp (if applicable) that the work does not conform to the foregoing warranty, Contractor shall after receipt of notice from Company, promptly perform any and all corrective work required to make the services conform to the Warranty. Such corrective Work shall be performed entirely at Contractor's own expenses. If such corrective Work is not performed within a reasonable time, the Company, at its option may have such remedial Work performed by others and charge the cost thereof to Contractor subject to a maximum of the contract value payable for the defective work which needs corrective action which the Contractor must pay promptly. In case Contractor fails to perform remedial work, or pay promptly in respect thereof, the performance security shall be forfeited.

7.0 CONFIDENTIALITY, USE OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION:

7.1 Contractor shall not, without Company's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing pattern, sample or information furnished by or on behalf of Company in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by Contractor in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far, as may be necessary for purposes of such performance with prior permission from Company. However, nothing hereinabove contained shall deprive the Contractor of the right to use or disclose any information :

(a) which is possessed by the Contractor, as evidenced by the Contractor's written records, before receipt thereof from the Company which however the Contractor shall immediately inform to Company ; or

(b) which is required to be disclosed by the Contractor pursuant to an order of a court of competent jurisdiction or other governmental agency having the power to order such disclosure, provided the Contractor uses its best efforts to provide timely notice to Company of such order to permit Company an opportunity to contest such order subject to prior permission from Company.

7.2 Contractor shall not, without Company's prior written consent, make use of any document or information except for purposes of performing the contract.

7.3 Any document supplied to the Contractor in relation to the contract other than the Contract itself remain the property of Company and shall be returned (in all copies) to Company on completion of Contractor's performance under the Contract if so required by Company.

7.4 During this Contract, Company and its employees, agents, other contractors, sub-contractors (of any tier) and their employees etc may be exposed to certain Confidential information and data of the Contractor. Such information and data shall held by the Company, its employees, agents, other contractors, sub-contractors (of any tier) and their employees in the strictest Confidence and shall not be disclosed to any other party except on a need to know basis.

7.5 However, the above obligation shall not extend to information which:

i) is, at the time of disclosure, known to the public which Contractor shall immediately inform Company ;

ii) is lawfully becomes at a later date known to the public through no fault of Contractor subject to Contractor's undertaking that no information has been divulged by them to the public;

iii) is lawfully possessed by Contractor before receipt thereof from Company which should be immediately informed to Company;

iv) is developed by Contractor independently of the information disclosed by Company which should be shared with the Company;

v) Contractor is required to produce before competent authorities or by court order subject to prior permission from Company;

8.0 **TAXES:**

8.1 Tax levied on Contractor as per the provisions of Indian Income Tax Act and any other enactment/rules on income derived/payments received under the contract will be on Contractor's account.

8.2 Contractor shall be responsible for payment of personal taxes, if any, for all the personnel deployed in India by Contractor.

8.3 The Contractor shall furnish to the Company, if and when called upon to do so, relevant statement of accounts or any other information pertaining to work done under the contract for submitting the same to the Tax authorities, on specific request from them in accordance with provisions under the law. Other than the information provided by the Contractor, the Contractor shall not be responsible for any inaccurate information provided by the Company to the Tax authorities and the Company shall indemnify the Contractor for all claims, expenses, costs or losses of any nature arising from such inaccuracy. Contractor shall be responsible for preparing and filing the return of income etc. within the prescribed time limit to the appropriate authority.

8.4 Prior to start of operations under the contract, the Contractor shall furnish the Company with the necessary documents, as asked for by the Company and/or any other information pertaining to the contract, which may be required to be submitted to the Income Tax authorities at the time of obtaining "No Objection Certificate" for releasing payments to the Contractor.

8.5 Corporate income tax will be deducted at source from the invoice at the specified rate of income tax as per the provisions of Indian Income Tax Act as may be in force from time to time and Company will issue TDS Certificate to the Contractor as per the provisions of Income Tax Act.

8.6 Corporate and personnel taxes on Contractor shall be the liability of the Contractor and the Company shall not assume any responsibility on this account.

8.7 All local taxes, levies, duties, octroi etc. on purchases and sales made by Contractor (except GST) shall be borne by the Contractor.

8.8 **Goods and Services Tax (GST):** The quoted price should be exclusive of GST and the GST as applicable shall be to the Company account. The GST amount on the taxable part of the services provided by the Contractor shall be paid by the Company as per provisions of the GST Act. Bidder should take note of the following while submitting their offer in GST regime.

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX:

G1. "GST" shall mean Goods and Services Tax charged on the supply of material(s) and services. The term "GST" shall be construed to include the Integrated Goods and Services Tax (hereinafter referred to as "IGST") or Central

Goods and Services Tax (hereinafter referred to as “CGST”) or State Goods and Services Tax (hereinafter referred to as “SGST”) or Union Territory Goods and Services Tax (hereinafter referred to as “UTGST”) depending upon the import / interstate or intrastate supplies, as the case may be. It shall also mean GST compensation Cess, if applicable.

G2. The quoted price shall be deemed to be inclusive of all taxes and duties except “Goods and Services Tax” (hereinafter called GST) (i.e. IGST or CGST and SGST/UTGST applicable in case of interstate supply or intra state supply respectively and GST compensation Cess if applicable).

G3. Contractor/vendor shall be required to issue tax invoice in accordance with GST Act and/or Rules so that input credit can be availed by OIL (Oil India Limited)/Client. In the event that the contractor / vendor fails to provide the invoice in the form and manner prescribed under the GST Act read with GST Invoicing Rules thereunder, OIL / Client shall not be liable to make any payment on account of GST against such invoice.

G4. GST shall be paid against receipt of tax invoice and proof of payment of GST to government. In case of non-receipt of tax invoice or non-payment of GST by the contractor/vendor, OIL shall withhold the payment of GST.

G5. GST payable under reverse charge for specified services or goods under GST act or rules, if any, shall not be paid to the contractor/vendor but will be directly deposited to the government by OIL/Client.

G6. Where OIL/client has the obligation to discharge GST liability under reverse charge mechanism and OIL/client has paid or is /liable to pay GST to the Government on which interest or penalties becomes payable as per GST laws for any reason which is not attributable to OIL/client or ITC with respect to such payments is not available to OIL/client for any reason which is not attributable to OIL/client, then OIL/client shall be entitled to deduct/ setoff / recover such amounts against any amounts paid or payable by OIL/Client to Contractor / Supplier.

G7. The Supplier shall always comply with the requirements of applicable laws and provide necessary documents as prescribed under the Rules & Regulations, as applicable from time to time. In particular, if any tax credit, refund or other benefit is denied or delayed to OIL / Project Owner due to any non-compliance / delayed compliance by the Supplier under the Goods & Service Tax Act (such as failure to upload the details of the sale on the GSTN portal, failure to pay GST to the Government) or due to non-furnishing or furnishing of incorrect or incomplete documents by the Supplier, the Supplier shall be liable to reimburse OIL / Project Owner for all such losses and other consequences including, but not limited to the tax loss, interest and penalty.

G8. Notwithstanding anything contained anywhere in the Agreement, in the event that the input tax credit of the GST charged by the Contractor / Vendor is denied by the tax authorities to OIL / Client for reasons attributable to Contractor / Vendor, OIL / client shall be entitled to recover such amount from the Contractor / Vendor by way of adjustment from the next invoice. In addition to the amount

of GST, OIL / client shall also be entitled to recover interest at the rate prescribed under GST Act and penalty, in case any penalty is imposed by the tax authorities on OIL / Project Owner.

G9. TDS under GST, if applicable, shall be deducted from contractor's/vendor's bill at applicable rate and a certificate as per rules for tax so deducted shall be provided to the contractor/vendor.

G10. The Contractor will be under obligation for charging correct rate of tax as prescribed under the respective tax laws. Further the Contractor shall avail and pass on benefits of all exemptions/ concessions available under tax laws.

G11. The contractor will be liable to ensure to have registered with the respective tax authorities and to submit self-attested copy of such registration certificate(s) and the Contractor will be responsible for procurement of material in its own registration (GSTIN) and also to issue its own Road Permit/ E-way Bill, if applicable etc.

G12. In case the bidder is covered under Composition Scheme under GST laws, then bidder should quote the price inclusive of the GST (CGST & SGST/UTGST or IGST). Further, such bidder should mention "Cover under composition system" in column for GST (CGST & SGST/UTGST or IGST) of price schedule.

G13. OIL/client will prefer to deal with registered supplier of goods/ services under GST. Therefore, bidders are requested to get themselves registered under GST, if not registered yet. However, in case any unregistered bidder is submitting their bid, their prices will be loaded with applicable GST while evaluation of bid. Where OIL/client is entitled for input credit of GST, the same will be considered for evaluation of bid as per evaluation methodology of tender document.

G14. GST (GOODS & SERVICE TAX) (TRANSPORTATION CHARGES, SUPERVISION / TRAINING, SITE WORK):

The quoted Prices towards Transportation, Supervision, Training, Site Work, AMC shall be inclusive of all taxes & levies except Goods & Service Tax (GST).

Goods & Service Tax (GST) as billed by the Supplier shall be payable at actuals by Owner subject to Contractor furnishing proper tax invoice issued in accordance with Goods & Service Tax (GST) rules to enable Owner to take input tax credit as per Govt. Rules 2004 on Goods & Service Tax (GST) paid.

Goods & Service Tax (GST) shall not be payable, if the requirements as specified above are not fulfilled by the Supplier. In case of non-receipt of above, Owner shall withhold the payment of Goods & Service Tax (GST).

In case of Foreign Bidders, where foreign bidder does not have permanent establishment in India, for supervision/training services by foreign supervisor at Project Site, Goods & Service Tax (GST) shall be paid by Owner to tax authorities.

G15. Documentation requirement for GST

The vendor will be under the obligation for invoicing correct tax rate of tax/duties as prescribed under the GST law to Owner/OIL, and pass on the benefits, if any, after availing input tax credit.

Any invoice issued shall contain the following particulars-

- a) Name, address and GSTIN of the supplier;
- b) Serial number of the invoice;
- c) Date of issue;
- d) Name, address and GSTIN or UIN, if registered of the recipient;
- e) Name and address of the recipient and the address of the delivery, along with the State and its code,
- f) HSN code of goods or Accounting Code of services;
- g) Description of goods or services;
- h) Quantity in case of goods and unit or Unique Quantity Code thereof;
- i) Total value of supply of goods or services or both;
- j) Taxable value of supply of goods or services or both taking into discount or abatement if any;
- k) Rate of tax (IGST,CGST, SGST/ UTGST, cess);
- l) Amount of tax charged in respect of taxable goods or services (IGST,CGST, SGST/ UTGST, cess);
- m) Place of supply along with the name of State, in case of supply in the course of inter-state trade or commerce;
- n) Address of the delivery where the same is different from the place of supply and
- o) Signature or digital signature of the supplier or his authorised representative.

GST invoice shall be prepared in triplicate, in case of supply of goods, in the following manner-

- a) The original copy being marked as ORIGINAL FOR RECIPIENT;
- b) The duplicate copy being marked as DUPLICATE FOR TRANSPORTER and
- c) The triplicate copy being marked as TRIPLICATE FOR SUPPLIER.

In case of any advance given against any supplies contract, the supplier of the goods shall issue Receipt Voucher containing the details of details of advance taken along with particulars as mentioned in clause no. 15. (a), (b), (c), (d), (g), (k), (l), (m) & (o) above.

G16. GENERAL REMARKS ON TAXES & DUTIES:

In view of GST Implementation from 1st July 2017, all taxes and duties including Excise Duty, CST/VAT, Service tax, Entry Tax and other indirect taxes and duties have been submerged in GST. Accordingly reference of Excise Duty, Service Tax, VAT, Sales Tax, Entry Tax, E1/E2 Forms, and any other form of indirect tax except of GST mentioned in the bidding document shall be ignored.

9.0 **INSURANCE:**

9.1 The Contractor shall arrange insurance to cover all risks in respect of their personnel, materials and equipment (except when tools / equipment are below Rotary Table or in the well bore) belonging to the Contractor or its subcontractor (if applicable) during the currency of the contract including the third party

items/consumables. For materials/equipment belong to the Contractor or its sub-contractor, Contractor may self-insure the same.

9.2 Contractor shall at all time during the currency of the contract provide, pay for and maintain the following insurance amongst others except when tools/ equipment are below Rotary Table or in the well bore :

- a) Workmen compensation insurance as required by the laws of the country of origin of the employee.
- b) Employer's Liability Insurance as required by law in the country of origin of employee.
- c) General Public Liability Insurance or Comprehensive General Liability insurance covering liabilities including contractual liability for bodily injury, including death of persons, and liabilities for damage of property. This insurance must cover all operations of Contractor required to fulfil the provisions under this contract.
- d) Contractor's equipment used for execution of the work hereunder shall have an insurance cover with a suitable limit (as per international standards) except when tools /equipment are below Rotary Table or in the well bore or Contractor may self-insure its tools/ equipment.
- e) Automobile Public Liability Insurance covering owned and hired automobiles used in the performance of the work hereunder, with bodily injury limits and property damage limits as governed by Indian Insurance regulations.
- f) Public Liability Insurance as required under Public Liability Insurance Act 1991, "if applicable".

9.3 Any deductible set forth in any of the above insurance shall be borne by Contractor.

9.4 Contractor shall furnish to Company prior to commencement date, certificates of all its insurance policies covering the risks mentioned above.

9.5 If any of the above policies expire or are cancelled during the term of this contract and Contractor fails for any reason to renew such policies, then the Company will renew/replace same and charge the cost thereof to Contractor. Should there be a lapse in any insurance required to be carried out by the Contractor for any reason whatsoever, loss/damage claims resulting there from shall be to the sole account of Contractor.

9.6 Contractor shall require all of his sub-Contractor to provide such of the foregoing insurance coverage as Contractor is obliged to provide under this Contract and inform the Company about the coverage prior to the commencement of agreements with its sub-Contractors.

9.7 All insurance taken out by Contractor or their sub-contractor shall be endorsed to provide that the underwriters waive their rights of recourse on the Company and to the extent of the liabilities assumed by Contractor under this Contract.

9.8 Contractor shall obtain additional insurance or revise the limits of existing insurance as per Company's request in which case additional cost shall be to Contractor's account.

10.0 CHANGES:

10.1 During the performance of the work, Company may make minor change to take care of any supplementary work within the general scope of this Contract including, but not limited to, changes in methodology, and minor additions to or deletions from the work to be performed. Contractor shall perform the work as changed. Changes of this nature will be affected by written order by the Company.

10.2 If any change result in an increase in compensation due to Contractor or in a credit due to Company, Contractor shall submit to Company an estimate of the amount of such compensation or credit in a form prescribed by Company. Such estimates shall be based on the rates shown in the Schedule of Rates (Part-3, Section IV). Upon review of Contractor's estimate, Contractor shall establish and set forth in the Change Order the amount of the compensation or credit for the change or a basis for determining a reasonable compensation or credit for the change. If Contractor disagrees with compensation or credit set forth in the Change Order, Contractor shall nevertheless perform the work as changed, and the parties will resolve the dispute in accordance with Clause 13 hereunder. Contractor's performance of the work as changed will not prejudice Contractor's request for additional compensation for work performed under the Change Order.

11.0 FORCE MAJEURE :

11.1 In the event of either party being rendered unable by `Force Majeure' to perform any obligation required to be performed by them under the contract, the relative obligation of the party affected by such `Force Majeure' will stand suspended for the period during which such cause lasts. The word `Force Majeure' as employed herein shall mean acts of God, war, revolt, agitation, strikes, riot, fire, flood, sabotage, civil commotion, road barricade (but not due to interference of employment problem of the Contractor), acts of government of the two parties, which makes performance impossible or impracticable and any other cause, whether of kind herein enumerated or otherwise which are not within the control of the party to the contract and which renders performance of the contract by the said party impossible.

11.2 Upon occurrence of such cause and upon its termination, the party alleging that it has been rendered unable as aforesaid thereby, shall notify the other party in writing within Seventy Two (72) hours of the alleged beginning and ending thereof, giving full particulars and satisfactory evidence in support of its claim.

11.3 Should `force majeure' condition as stated above occurs and should the same be notified within seventy two (72) hours after its occurrence the `force majeure' rate shall apply for the first fifteen(15) days. Parties will have the right to terminate the Contract if such `force majeure' conditions continue beyond fifteen (15) days with prior written notice. Should either party decide not to terminate the Contract even under such condition, no payment would apply after expiry of fifteen(15) days force majeure period unless otherwise agreed to.

11.4 Force majeure' rate shall apply only on Standby charges of the tools, even if tools are BRT (Below Rotary Table).

12.0 TERMINATION:

12.1 TERMINATION ON EXPIRY OF THE TERMS (DURATION): This contract shall be deemed to have been automatically terminated on the expiry of duration of the contract, thereof.

12.2 TERMINATION ON ACCOUNT OF FORCE MAJEURE: Either party shall have the right to terminate this Contract on account of Force Majeure as set forth in Article 11.0 above.

12.3 TERMINATION ON ACCOUNT OF INSOLVENCY: In the event that the Contractor or its collaborator at any time during the term of the Contract, becomes insolvent or makes a voluntary assignment of its assets for the benefit of creditors or is adjudged bankrupt, then the Company shall, by a notice in writing have the right to terminate the Contract and all the Contractor's rights and privileges hereunder, shall stand terminated forthwith.

12.4 TERMINATION FOR UNSATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE: If the Company considers that, the performance of the Contractor is unsatisfactory, or not upto the expected standard, the Company shall notify the Contractor in writing and specify in details the cause of the dissatisfaction. The Company shall have the option to terminate the Contract by giving 15 days notice in writing to the Contractor, if Contractor fails to comply with the requisitions contained in the said written notice issued by the Company.

12.5 TERMINATION DUE TO CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP & ASSIGNMENT: In case the Contractor's rights and /or obligations under this Contract and/or the Contractor's rights, title and interest to the equipment/ material, are transferred or assigned without the Company's consent, the Company may at its absolute discretion, terminate this Contract.

12.6 TERMINATION DUE TO NON-AVAILABILITY OF EQUIPMENT/PERSONNEL : If at any time during the term of this Contract, breakdown of Contractor's equipment results in Contractors being unable to perform their obligations hereunder for a period of 15 successive days, Company at its option, may terminate this Contract in its entirety without any further right or obligation on the part of the Company, except for the payment of money then due. No notice shall be served by the Company under the condition stated above.

12.7 Notwithstanding any provisions herein to the contrary, the Contract may be terminated at any time by the company on giving 15 (fifteen) days written notice to the Contractor due to any other reason not covered under the above clause from 12.1 to 12.6 and in the event of such termination the Company shall not be liable to pay any cost or damage to the Contractor except for payment of services as per the Contract upto the date of termination including the Demob cost, if any.

12.8 CONSEQUENCES OF TERMINATION:

In all cases of termination herein set forth, the relative obligations of the parties to the Contract shall be limited to the period up to the date of termination. Notwithstanding the termination of this Contract, the parties shall continue to be bound by the provisions of this Contract that reasonably require some action or forbearance after such termination.

12.9 Upon termination of this Contract, Contractor shall return to Company all of Company's items, which are at the time in Contractor's possession.

12.10 In the event of termination of contract, Company will issue Notice of termination of the contract with date or event after which the contract will be terminated. The contract shall then stand terminated and the Contractor shall demobilize their personnel & materials.

13.0 SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES AND ARBITRATION:

13.1 Arbitration(Applicable for Suppliers/Contractors other than PSU) :

Except as otherwise provided elsewhere in the contract, if any dispute, difference, question or disagreement arises between the parties hereto or their respective representatives or assignees, in connection with construction, meaning, operation, effect, interpretation of the contract or breach thereof which parties are unable to settle mutually, the same shall be referred to Arbitration as provided hereunder:

1. A party wishing to commence arbitration proceeding shall invoke Arbitration Clause by giving 30 days notice to the other party. The notice invoking arbitration shall specify all the points of dispute with details of the amount claimed to be referred to arbitration at the time of invocation of arbitration and not thereafter. If the claim is in foreign currency, the claimant shall indicate its value in Indian Rupee for the purpose of constitution of the arbitral tribunal.

2. The number of arbitrators and the appointing authority will be as under:

Above INR 5 Crore	3 Arbitrators	One Arbitrator by each party and the 3rd Arbitrator, who shall be the presiding Arbitrator, by the two Arbitrators.

3. The parties agree that they shall appoint only those persons as arbitrators who accept the conditions of the arbitration clause. No person shall be appointed as Arbitrator or Presiding Arbitrator who does not accept the conditions of the arbitration clause.

4. Parties agree that there will be no objection if the Arbitrator appointed holds equity shares of OIL and/or is a retired officer of OIL/any PSU. However, neither party shall appoint its serving employees as arbitrator.

5. If any of the Arbitrators so appointed dies, resigns, becomes incapacitated or withdraws for any reason from the proceedings, it shall be lawful for the concerned party/arbitrators to appoint another person in his place in the same manner as aforesaid. Such person shall proceed with the reference from the stage where his predecessor had left if both parties consent for the same ; otherwise, he shall proceed de novo.

6. Parties agree that neither shall be entitled for any pre-reference or pendent-lite interest on its claims. Parties agree that any claim for such interest made by any party shall be void.

7. The arbitral tribunal shall make and publish the award within time stipulated as under:

Amount of Claims and counter claims(excluding interest)	Period for making and publishing of the award(counted from the date of first meeting of the Arbitrators)
Upto INR 5 Crore	Within 8 months
Above INR 5 Crore	Within 12 months

The above time limit can be extended by Arbitrator, for reasons to be recorded in writing, with the consent of the other parties.

8. If after commencement of the arbitration proceedings, the parties agree to settle the dispute mutually or refer the dispute to conciliation, the arbitrators shall put the proceedings in abeyance until such period as requested by the parties.

9. Each party shall be responsible to make arrangements for the travel and stay etc. of the arbitrator pointed by it. Claimant shall also be responsible for making arrangements for travel/stay arrangements of the Presiding Arbitrator and the expenses incurred shall be shared equally by the parties.

In case of sole arbitrator, OIL shall make all necessary arrangements for his travel, stay and the expenses incurred shall be shared equally by the parties.

10. The Arbitration shall be held at the place from where the contract has been awarded. However, parties to the contract can agree for a different place for the convenience of all concerned.

11. The Arbitrator(s) shall give reasoned and speaking award and it shall be final and binding on the parties.

12. Subject to aforesaid, provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and any statutory modifications or re-enactment thereof shall apply to the arbitration proceedings under this clause.

13. Arbitration clause for Settlement of commercial disputes between Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) inter se and CPSE(s) and Government Department(s)/Organizations(s) - Administrative Mechanism for Resolution of CPSEs Disputes (AMRCD).

In the event of any dispute or difference relating to the interpretation and application of the provisions of commercial contract(s) between Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs)/ Port Trusts inter se and also between CPSEs and Government Departments/Organizations (excluding disputes concerning Railways, Income Tax, Customs & Excise Departments), such dispute or difference shall be taken up by either party for resolution through AMRCD as mentioned in OPE OM No. 4(1)/2013-DPE(GM)/FTS-1835 dated 22-05-2018.

14.0 NOTICES:

14.1 Any notice given by one party to other, pursuant to this Contract shall be sent in writing or by telex or Fax and confirmed in writing to the applicable address specified below:

14.2 A notice shall be effective when delivered or on the notice's effective date, whichever is later.

15.0 SUBCONTRACTING/ASSIGNMENT:

15.1 Contractor shall not subcontract, transfer or assign the contract, in full or any part under this contract, to any third party (ies). Except for the main services under this contract, Contractor may sub-contract the petty support services subject to Company's prior approval. However, Contractor shall be fully responsible for complete execution and performance of the services under the Contract.

16.0 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS:

16.1 Contractor shall give notices and pay all fees at their own cost required to be given or paid by any National or State Statute, Ordinance, or other Law or any regulation, or bye-law of any local or other duly constituted authority as may be in force from time to time in India, in relation to the performance of the services and by the rules & regulations of all public bodies and companies whose property or rights are affected or may be affected in any way by the services.

16.2 Contractor shall conform in all respects with the provisions of any Statute, Ordinance of Law as aforesaid and the regulations or bye-law of any local or other duly constituted authority which may be applicable to the services and with such rules and regulation public bodies and Companies as aforesaid and shall keep Company indemnified against all penalties and liability of every kind for breach of any such Statute, Ordinance or Law, regulation or bye-law.

16.3 During the tenure of the Contract, Contractor shall keep the site where the services are being performed reasonably free from all unnecessary obstruction and shall store or dispose of any equipment and surplus materials and clear away and remove from the site any wreckage, rubbish or temporary works no longer required. On the completion of the services, Contractor shall clear away and remove from the site any surplus materials, rubbish or temporary works of every kind and leave the whole of the site clean and in workmanlike condition to the satisfaction of the Company.

16.4 Key personnel cannot be changed during the tenure of the Contract except due to sickness/death/resignation of the personnel in which case the replaced person should have equal experience and qualification, which will be again subject to approval, by the Company.

17.0 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES FOR DEFAULT IN TIMELY MOBILISATION:

17.1 Time is the essence of this Contract. In the event of the Contractor's default in timely mobilization for commencement of operations within the stipulated period, the Contractor shall be liable to pay liquidated damages @ 1/2% of contract value including mobilization cost, per week or part thereof of delay subject to maximum of 7.5%. Liquidated Damages will be reckoned from the expiry date of the scheduled mobilisation period as defined in para 2.2 above.

17.2 If the Contractor fails to mobilise within 45 days after the stipulated date, then the Company reserves the right to cancel the Contract without any compensation whatsoever.

17.3 The parties agree that the sum specified above is not a penalty but a genuine pre-estimate of the loss/damage which will be suffered by OIL on account of delay/breach on the part of the Contractor and the said amount will be payable without proof of actual loss or damage caused by such delay/breach and without any demur and shall not be open for any dispute whatsoever.

18.0 PERFORMANCE SECURITY:

The Contractor has furnished to Company a Bank Guarantee No. _____ dated _____ issued by _____ for _____ (being 10% of annualized estimated Contract Price) with validity of three (03) months beyond the contract period. The performance security shall be payable to Company as compensation for any loss resulting from Contractor's failure to fulfill their obligations under the Contract. In the event of extension of the Contract period, the validity of the bank guarantee shall be suitably extended by the Contractor. The bank guarantee will be discharged by Company not later than 30 days following its expiry.

19.0 ASSOCIATION OF COMPANY'S PERSONNEL: Company's engineer/chemist will be associated with the work throughout the operations. The Contractor shall execute the work with professional competence and in an efficient and workman like manner and provide Company with a standard of work customarily provided by reputed IP Survey Contractors to major international oil companies in the petroleum industry.

20.0 LABOUR: The recruitment of the labour shall be met from the areas of operation and wages will be according to the rates prevalent at the time which can be obtained from the District Authorities of the area. The facilities to be given to the labourers should conform to the provisions of labour laws as per contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970.

21.0 LIABILITY:

21.1 Except as otherwise expressly provided, neither Company nor its servants, agents, nominees, Contractors, or sub-contractors shall have any liability or responsibility whatsoever to whomsoever for loss of or damage to the equipment and/or loss of or damage to the property of the Contractor and/or their Contractors or sub-contractors, irrespective of how such loss or damage is caused and even if caused by the negligence of Company and/or its servants, agent, nominees, assignees, contractors and sub-Contractors. The Contractor shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless Company from and against such loss or damage and any suit, claim or expense resulting there from.

21.2 Neither Company nor its servants, agents, nominees, assignees, Contractors, sub-contractors or its Affiliates or Coventurers shall have any liability or responsibility whatsoever for injury to, illness, or death of any employee of the Contractor and/or of its Contractors or sub-contractor irrespective of how such injury, illness or death is caused and even if caused by the negligence of Company and/or its servants, agents nominees, assignees, Contractors and sub-contractors. Contractor shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless Company from and against such liabilities and any suit, claim or expense resulting there from.

21.3 The Contractor hereby agrees to waive its right of recourse and further agrees to cause its underwriters to waive their right of subrogation against Company and/or its underwriters, servants, agents, nominees, assignees, Contractors and sub-contractors for loss or damage to the equipment of the Contractor and/or its sub-contractors and/or their employees when such loss or damage or liabilities arises out of or in connection with the performance of the contract limited to the Contractor's liabilities agreed to under this Contract.

21.4 The Contractor hereby further agrees to waive its right of recourse and agrees to cause its underwriters to waive their right of subrogation against Company and/or its underwriters, servants, agents, nominees, assignees, Contractors and sub-contractors for injury to, illness or death of any employee of the Contractor and of its contractors, sub-contractors and/or their employees when such injury, illness or death arises out of or in connection with the performance of the contract limited to the Contractor's liabilities agreed to under this Contract.

21.5 Except as otherwise expressly provided, neither Contractor nor its servants, agents, nominees, Contractors or sub-contractors shall have any liability or responsibility whatsoever to whomsoever for loss of or damage to the equipment and/or loss or damage to the property of the Company and/or their Contractors or sub-contractors, irrespective of how such loss or damage is caused and even if caused by the negligence of Contractor and/or its servants, agents, nominees, assignees, Contractors and sub-contractors. The Company shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless Contractor from and against such loss or damage and any suit, claim or expense resulting there from.

21.6 Neither Contractor nor its servants, agents, nominees, assignees, Contractors, sub-contractors shall have any liability or responsibility whatsoever to whomsoever for injury or illness, or death of any employee of the Company and/or of its Contractors or sub-contractors irrespective of how such injury, illness or death is caused and even if caused by the negligence of Contractor and/or its servants, agents, nominees, assignees, Contractors and sub-contractors. Company shall protect, defend indemnify and hold harmless Contractor from and against such liabilities and any suit, claim or expense resulting there from.

21.7 The Company agrees to waive its right of recourse and further agrees to cause its underwriters to waive their right of subrogation against Contractor and/or its underwriters, servants, agents, nominees, assignees, Contractors and sub-contractors for loss or damage to the equipment of Company and/or its contractors or sub-contractors when such loss or damage or liabilities arises out of or in connection with the performance of the contract.

21.8 The Company hereby further agrees to waive its right of recourse and agrees to cause it underwriters to waive their right of subrogation against Contractor and/or its underwriters, servants, agents, nominees, assignees, Contractors and sub-contractors for injury to, illness or death of any employee of the Company and of its Contractors, sub-contractors and/or their employees when such injury, illness or death arises out of or in connection with the performance of the Contract.

22.0 **LIMITATION OF LIABILITY:** Notwithstanding any other provisions herein to the contrary, except only in cases of wilful misconduct and / or criminal acts,

(a) Neither the Contractor nor the Company (OIL) shall be liable to the other, whether in Contract, tort, or otherwise, for any consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs.

(b) Notwithstanding any other provisions incorporated elsewhere in the contract, the aggregate liability of the Contractor in respect of this contract, whether under Contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed 50% of the Annualized Contract Price, provided however that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment by the Contractor, or to any obligation of the Contractor to indemnify the Company with respect to Intellectual Property Rights.

(c) Company shall indemnify and keep indemnified Contractor harmless from and against any and all claims, costs, losses and liabilities in excess of the aggregate liability amount in terms of clause (b) above.

23.0 INDEMNITY AGREEMENT:

23.1 Except as provided hereof Contractor agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold Company harmless from and against all claims, suits, demands and causes of action, liabilities, expenses, cost, liens and judgments of every kind and character, without limit, which may arise in favour of Contractor's employees, agents, contractors and sub-contractors or their employees on account of bodily injury or death, or damage to personnel/property as a result of the operations contemplated hereby, regardless of whether or not said claims, demands or causes of action arise out of the negligence or otherwise, in whole or in part or other faults.

23.2 Except as provided hereof Company agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold Contractor harmless from and against all claims, suits, demands and causes of action, liabilities, expenses, cost, liens and judgments of every kind and character, without limit, which may arise in favour of Company's employees, agents, contractors and sub-contractors or their employees on account of bodily injury or death, or damage to personnel/property as a result of the operations contemplated hereby, regardless of whether or not said claims, demands or causes of action arise out of the negligence or otherwise, in whole or in part or other faults.

24.0 INDEMNITY APPLICATION: The indemnities given herein above, whether given by Company or Contractor shall be without regard to fault or to the negligence of either party even though said loss, damage, liability, claim, demand, expense, cost or cause of action may be caused, occasioned by or contributed to by the negligence, either sole or concurrent of either party.

24.1 The Contractor shall not make Company liable to reimburse the Contractor to the statutory increase in the wage rates of the contract labour appointed by the Contractor. Such statutory or any other increase in the wage rates of the contract labour shall be borne by the Contractor.

24.2 Any permission from the Mines Directorate in connection with working in excess of 8 (eight) hours per day shift pattern by the Contractor shall have to be arranged by the Contractor before commencement of the Contract, in consultation with the Company. Moreover, since the Contractor's personnel engaged shall be working under the Mines Act and Oil Mines Regulations, the Contractor shall have to obtain any other relevant permission from the Mines Directorate to engage their employees in compliance with various procedures as per Mines Act. In case of any breach of procedures under Mines Act the Contractor shall be held responsible and they shall bear all expenses arising as a result thereof.

24.3 The Contractor shall not engage labour below 18 (eighteen) years of age under any circumstances. Persons above 60 (sixty) years age also shall not be deployed except Manager / Superintendent.

24.4 Moreover, the Contractor should obtain and produce in advance to commencement of Work the following certificate / approvals:

- (i) Approval from DGMS / DDMS for shift patterns in excess of 8 hours.
- (ii) Total manpower list.
- (iii) License/certificate from specified electrical authorities for the rig and camp electrical personnel, if required.
- (iv) All certificates as per applicable laws including Mines Acts.
- (v) Regional Labour certificate, if required.

25.0 **ENTIRE CONTRACT:** This Contract contains the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes any previous understandings, commitments, agreements or representations whatsoever, oral or written, pertaining to the subject matter hereof, provided that nothing in this Clause (Entire Contract) shall have effect to exclude or restrict the liability of either Party for fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation.

26.0 **RECORDS, REPORTS AND INSPECTION:** The Contractor shall, at all times, permit the Company and its authorised employees and representatives to inspect all the Work performed and to witness and check all the measurements and tests made in connection with the said work. The Contractor shall keep an authentic, accurate history and logs including safety records of each IP survey section with major items consumed, which shall be open at all reasonable times for inspection by the Company designated representatives and its authorised employees and representatives. The Contractor shall provide the Company designated representatives with a daily written report, on form prescribed by the Company showing details of operations during the preceding 24 hours and any other information related to the said IP survey requested by the Company whenever so requested. The Contractor shall not, without Company's written consent allow any third person(s) access to the said survey, or give out to any third person information in connection therewith.

27.0 **INSPECTION OF MATERIALS**

27.1 **INSPECTION BY CONTRACTOR:** The Contractor agrees to perform a visual inspection, using its personnel, of all materials and appliances furnished by the Company when delivered into Contractor's possession and shall notify Company's representative of any apparent defects observed therein so that Company may replace such defective materials or appliances. If Contractor fails to notify the Company of any apparent defects as provided above, it shall be conclusively presumed that such materials and appliances are free from such apparent defect. Contractor shall not be liable for any loss or damage resulting from the use of materials or appliances furnished by the Company containing latent defects. Upon the termination of this Agreement, Contractor shall return to the Company at the Well- site all machinery, equipment, tools, spare parts and supplies received by Contractor from the Company or purchased by the Contractor for the Company's account and not used or consumed in the operations, in as good condition as when received by Contractor, normal wear & tear excepted. If damage to any of the Company's equipment is caused due to sole negligence of the Contractor, same will be repaired or replaced at Contractor's cost. Contractor shall, if requested by the Company also maintain or repair, at its cost, any of the Company's items, at the Drilling Unit which Contractor is qualified to and can

maintain or repair with Contractor's normal complement of personnel and the equipment at the Drilling Unit provided however that the Company shall at its cost provide all spare parts and materials required to maintain or repair the Company's items. However, it shall remain the Company's basic responsibility and liability to ensure that such items are always in good workable condition.

27.2 INSPECTION BY OPERATOR: The Company shall have the right to inspect and reject for any valid cause any items furnished by Contractor and Contractor shall replace or repair at its sole expense such items so rejected with items free of defects, to the satisfaction of the Company.

28.0 ROYALTY AND PATENTS: Each party shall hold harmless and indemnify the other from and against all claim and proceedings for or on account of any patent rights, design, trade mark or other protected rights arising from any use of materials, equipment, processes, inventions and methods which have not been imposed on the attending party by the terms of the contract or the specifications or drawings forming part thereof.

29.0 PAYMENTS, MANNER OF PAYMENT, RATES OF PAYMENT:

29.1 Company shall pay to the Contractor during the term of the Contract the amount due from time to time calculated according to the rates of payment set and in accordance with other provisions hereof. No. other payments shall be due from company unless specifically provided for in the Contract. Payment to the third party supplier(s) of the items/consumables shall be made after receipt of goods at site in Rajasthan duly certified by authorized personnel of the Company. All payments will be made in accordance with the terms hereinafter described.

29.2 MANNER OF PAYMENT: All payments due by company to Contractor hereunder shall be made at Contractor's designated bank. Bank charges, if any will be on account of the Contractor.

29.3 Payment of any invoices shall not prejudice the right of company to question the validity of any charges therein, provided company within one year after the date of payment shall make and deliver to contractor written notice of objection to any item or items the validity of which Company questions.

29.4 INVOICES: Mobilization charges will be invoiced only upon completion of mobilization when the entire equipment, chemicals and personnel are ready at site for starting the job as certified by company representative. Payment of mobilization charges shall be made within 45 days following the date of receipt of undisputed invoices by Company.

29.5 Contractor shall send invoice to company on the day following the end of each month for all daily or monthly charges due to the contractor.

29.6 Contractor will submit Three (03) sets of all invoices duly super scribed 'Original' and 'copy' as applicable to the company for processing payment. Separate invoices for the charges payable under the contract shall be submitted by the Contractor for foreign currency and Indian currency.

29.7 Payment of monthly invoices, if undisputed, shall be made within 30 days following the date of receipt of invoice by Company.

29.8 Company shall within 30 days of receipt of the invoice notify the contractor of any item under dispute, specifying the reasons thereof, in which event, payment of the disputed amount may be withheld until settlement of the dispute, but payment shall be made of any undisputed portion on or before the due date. This will not prejudice the company's right to question the validity of the payment at a later date as envisaged in Clause 31.3 above.

29.9 The acceptance by Contractor of part payment on any billing not paid on or before the due date shall not be deemed a waiver of Contractor's rights in any other billing, the payment of which may then or thereafter be due.

29.10 Payment of Final demobilization charges shall be made if applicable within 45 days on receipt of invoice by Company accompanied by the following documents from the Contractor :

- a) Audited account up to completion of the Contract.
- b) Tax audit report for the above period as required under the Indian Tax Laws.
- c) Documentary evidence regarding the submission of returns and payment to taxes for the expatriate personnel engaged by the Contractor or by its sub-contractor.
- d) Proof of re-export of all items including the unutilized spares and consumables (excepting consumables consumed during the contract period) and also cancellation of re-export bond if any.
- e) Any other documents as required by applicable Indian Laws.

In case, no demobilization charges are payable, the documents mentioned above will have to be submitted by the Contractor before release of the final payment by the Company. A certificate from Chartered Accountant on (a), (b) & (c) above will suffice

29.11 Contractor shall maintain complete and correct records of all information on which contractor's invoice are based upto 1 (one) year from the date of last invoice. Such records shall be required for making appropriate adjustments or payments by either party in case of subsequent audit query / objection.

30.0 APPLICABLE LAW:

30.1 The Contract shall be deemed to be a Contract made under, governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India for the time being in force and shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of Courts situated in Jodhpur, Rajasthan.

30.2 The Contractor shall ensure full compliance of various Indian Laws and Statutory Regulations, to the extent applicable, as stated below, but not limited to, in force from time to time and obtain necessary permits/ licenses etc. from appropriate authorities for conducting operations under the Contract:

- a) The Mines Act 1952- as applicable to safety and employment conditions
- b) The Minimum Wages Act, 1948
- c) The Oil Mines Regulations, 1984
- d) The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923

- e) The Payment of Wages Act, 1963
- f) The Payment of Bonus Act, 1965
- g) The Contract Labour (Regulation & Abolition) Act, 1970 and the rules framed there under
- h) The Employees Pension Scheme, 1995
- i) The Interstate Migrant Workmen Act., 1979 (Regulation of employment and conditions of service)
- j) The Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952
- k) The Rajasthan Tax Act
- l) Service Tax Act
- m) Customs & Excise Act & Rules
- n) Rajasthan Entry Tax Act
- o) Income Tax Act. & Sales Tax Act.
- p) Insurance Act.
- q) HSE Guidelines

30.3 If any expatriate personnel are engaged by the Contractor to perform the services required under the contract, securing permission from the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), Ministry of Home Affairs (MOHA), Ministry of Defence (MOD) Govt. Of India and Local Authorities on time shall rest on the Contractor. OIL will only assist the Contractor by providing introductory letter / recommendatory letter required, if any, for securing the above permissions.

31.0 **SUBSEQUENTLY ENACTED LAWS:** Subsequent to the date of bid closing, if there is a change in or enactment of any law or change in application or enforcement or interpretation of existing law by any governmental authority or public body, which results in addition/ reduction in cost to Contractor on account of the operation contemplated under the Contract, the Company/Contractor shall reimburse the Contractor/pay Company for such additional/reduced costs actually incurred/saved by Contractor, subject to the submission of documentary evidence by Contractor/Company.

32.0 **SET-OFF:** Any sum of money due and payable to the Contractor (including Performance Security refundable to them) under this or any other Contract may be appropriated by OIL and set-off against any claim of OIL(or such other person or persons contracting through OIL) for payment of a sum of money arising out of this contract or under any other contract made by the Contractor with OIL(or such other person or persons contracting through OIL).

33.0 **WITHHOLDING:** Company may withhold or nullify the whole or any part of the amount due to Contractor, after informing the Contractor of the reasons in writing, on account of subsequently discovered evidence in order to protect Company from loss on account of :-

- a) For non-completion of jobs assigned as per Section-II.
- b) Contractor's indebtedness arising out of execution of this Contract.
- c) Defective work not remedied by Contractor.
- d) Claims by sub-Contractor of Contractor or others filed or on the basis of reasonable evidence indicating probable filing of such claims against Contractor.
- e) Failure of Contractor to pay or provide for the payment of salaries/ wages, contributions, unemployment compensation, taxes or enforced savings with-held from wages etc.

- f) Failure of Contractor to pay the cost of removal of unnecessary debris, materials, tools, or machinery.
- g) Damage to another Contractor of Company.
- h) All claims against Contractor for damages and injuries, and/or for non-payment of bills etc.
- i) Any failure by Contractor to fully reimburse Company under any of the indemnification provisions of this Contract. If, during the progress of the work Contractor shall allow any indebtedness to accrue for which Company, under any circumstances in the opinion of Company may be primarily or contingently liable or ultimately responsible and Contractor shall, within five days after demand is made by Company, fail to pay and discharge such indebtedness, then Company may during the period for which such indebtedness shall remain unpaid, withhold from the amounts due to Contractor, a sum equal to the amount of such unpaid indebtedness.

Withholding will also be effected on account of the following:-

- i) Order issued by a Court of Law in India.
- ii) Income-tax deductible at source according to law prevalent from time to time in the country.
- iii) Any obligation of Contractor which by any law prevalent from time to time to be discharged by Company in the event of Contractor's failure to adhere to such laws.
- iv) Any payment due from Contractor in respect of unauthorised imports.

When all the above grounds for withholding payments shall be removed, payment shall thereafter be made for amounts so with-hold.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the right of Company to withhold shall be limited to damages, claims and failure on the part of Contractor, which is directly/indirectly related to some negligent act or omission on the part of Contractor.

34.0 **WAIVER:** Any delay in exercising and any omission to exercise any right, power or remedy exercisable by the Company under this contract shall not impair such right, power or remedy nor shall any waiver by the Company of any breach by the Contractor of any provision of this contract prevent the subsequent enforcement of that provision by the Company or be deemed a waiver by the Company of any subsequent breach by the Contractor.

35.0 **INGRESS AND EGRESS AT LOCATION:**

35.1 The Company shall provide the Contractor, if required, requisite certificates for obtaining rights of ingress to, egress from locations where jobs are to be performed, including any certificates required for permits or licenses for the movement of the Contractor's personnel/equipment. Should such permits/licenses be delayed because of objections of concerned authorities in respect of specific Contractor's person(s), such person (s) should be promptly removed from the list by the Contractor and replaced with acceptable person (s).

36.0 **GENERAL HSE GUIDELINES:**

36.1 General guidelines with respect to Health, Safety and Environmental aspects Appendix – A refers.

37.0 **POLLUTION:**

37.1 The contractor shall be liable for all surface pollution to the extent caused by Contractor and resulting from spillage or dumping of solvents/additive substances or pollutants which the Contractor brings to the site for use in connection with work to be performed under this Contract.

37.2 The Company agrees that Contractor shall not be responsible for and company shall indemnify and hold Contractor, its agent, servants, officers and employees harmless from any liability, loss, cost or expenses or loss or damage from pollution or contamination arising out of or resulting from any of Contractor's services/operations unless such pollution or contamination is caused by Contractor's gross negligence.

38.0 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, it is agreed that Company shall release, Indemnify and hold Contractor and its sub-contractors harmless from any and all claims, judgments, losses, expenses and any costs related thereto (including but not limited to Court costs and Attorney fees) for

- a) Damage to or loss of any reservoir or producing formation, and/or
- b) Damage or loss of any well, and/or
- c) Any other subsurface damage or loss, and/or
- d) Any property damage or loss or personal injury or death arising out of or in connection with a blowout, fire explosion and loss of well control regardless of cause.

39.0 **FISHING:** In case it is necessary for Company to "fish" for any of Contractor's instruments or equipment, Company assumes the entire responsibility for such operations. However, Contractor shall provide necessary fishing equipment as per Section II "Scope of Work". Contractor will, if so desired by Company and without any responsibility or liability on Contractor's part render assistance, if required, for the recovery of such equipment and/or instruments. None of Contractor's employees are authorized to do anything other than assist/advise and consult with Company in connection with such fishing operations, and any fishing equipment furnished by Contractor is solely as an accommodation to the company and Contractor shall not be liable or responsible for a damage that Company may incur or sustain through its use or by reason of any advice or assistance rendered to Company by Contractor's agents or employees irrespective of cause.

SECTION - II

SCOPE OF WORK/TERMS OF REFERENCE/TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

The scope of this document is to define CONTRACTOR with COMPANY minimum requirement of services to be performed and portrays the guidelines, which the CONSULTANT shall satisfy or adhere to in the performance of the work.

The basic scopes of activities are outlined as:

- (i) Design and selection of SRP surface unit(s) based on well parameters and crude rheology as mentioned in the document.
- (ii) To provide SRP surface unit(s) along with manpower on charter hire basis.
- (iii) Operation and maintenance of the SRP unit during the contract period. The SRP units are to be operated at well sites located in the Baghewala Field of Bikaner-Nagaur Basin.

TERMS OF REFERENCE:

1. The services shall include design and selection of SRP surface unit(s) based on the well parameters and crude rheology mentioned in the document. CONTRACTOR to provide SRP surface unit(s) on charter hire basis as per the formulated design to ensure optimum oil production from the wells. The SRP units are to be operated at the SRP well sites located in the Baghewala Field of Bikaner-Nagaur Basin under COMPANY.

2. The requirement under this contract is for minimum 06 nos. of SRP Conventional units with the operating crew with each of them. The minimum required specification of the conventional unit is MODEL: C-228D-246-86 i.e stroke length 86 of API 11E Spec. The balance for the unit has to be beam balance. The minimum well lifting capacity is 60 bbls/day. Bidder has to provide reducer gear assembly with each unit of conventional SRP as the viscosity is very high. Bidder has to design the gear configuration (gear reducer) in such a way that the SPM is reduced to 2. However, it may be noted that OIL will decide the exact nature of SRP (Conventional or hydraulic) required and will intimate the bidder in advance.

3. CONTRACTOR shall provide necessary power to drive the units. Operation & maintenance of the same are under the scope of bidder.

4. The SRP surface unit(s) supplied by the contractor shall be fit for round the clock operations. Besides the SRP unit may be required to run intermittently as per the advice of Head-Production, Rajasthan Field, OIL. The intermittent SRP running duration may be extended or reduced upon operational requirement and the discretion of the COMPANY.

5. Transportation and commissioning of the unit at the well site shall be CONTRACTOR's responsibility. The rates are quoted accordingly by the party.

6. CONTRACTOR shall maintain the SRP unit in good working condition to provide satisfactory services for the contracted period of 24 (twenty four) months without any major failure/shut down, however 2 (two) days' time will be given for schedule maintenance like oil change greasing etc. of the unit during the contract period. COMPANY shall pay only 60% of the Day Rate (Rental) during the scheduled maintenance period. Day Rate (Rental) shall be calculated from Monthly Rate (Rental) on pro-rata basis. Normally, the minor repairs/maintenance of the SRP surface unit shall be carried out by the operators on site while SRP unit will be on ideal period due to well inflow behaviour.

7. Contractor shall ensure the availability of the SRP unit(s) and its operating crew throughout the period of contract. For availing scheduled maintenance off, prior consent of CGM-Production or the Coordinator from Production Department shall be sought in writing by the contractor. However, it may be clearly understood that permission for such scheduled maintenance days shall be under exclusive discretion of the company and should not be interpreted as a matter of right for the contractor.

8. Food and accommodation of contractor personnel at site shall be contractor's responsibility.

9. The SRP surface unit(s) mentioned above will be exclusive use of COMPANY during the entire duration of the contract, including extension if any. Unit(s) are, presently, planned to utilize in Baghewala / Tavriwala field. Deployment of the unit(s) shall be under exclusive discretion of the company. For inter-location movement of unit within Baghewala Field/ Tavriwala/ nearby field, all arrangements have to be made by bidder.

10. The supplied SRP unit shall have its own skid to erect the unit at well site. OIL will not provide any foundation for the SRP unit. The SRP surface unit(s) should be vibration free so as not to transmit any vibration to the Well/ Sucker Rods or damaging, in any manner to OIL property.

11. The vintage of the unit should not be more than five years from 01.01.2020. All the units have to be properly maintained and greased to avoid breakdown.

REPORTS & DELIVERABLES:

CONTRACTOR shall report to HoD-Production/COMPANY representative on daily basis and submit the daily report on a prescribed format. Contractor personals working at site shall have Mobile connection to contact with Jodhpur OIL office for day to day communication.

CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL:

A. CONTRACTOR shall be fully responsible for deploying one operator and one helper on each SRP unit having requisite qualification and experience to ensure trouble free operation as mentioned under Terms of reference. Manpower shall have adequate knowledge of well operation and Statutory safety norms. Each surface unit shall be manned by two personnel. CONTRACTOR personnel

mentioned herewith are not intended as being fully exhaustive and as such CONTRACTOR shall depute any other personnel required for the compliance of COMPANY work intended. OIL reserves the right to interact with the personal proposed for deployment to ensure the knowledge of the person about the SRP and well operation and if found not suitable for the operation OIL reserves to eject the person.

B. The driver(s) deployed by CONTRACTOR for mobilization, Demobilization and inter location movement shall have valid driving license for Heavy Motor Vehicle.

C. CONTRACTOR shall furnish along with Technical Bid the detailed Bio-data all Personnel to be deployed. COMPANY reserves the right to decide for engagement of these personnel on the basis of verification of relevant documents prior to engagement.

D. CONTRACTOR shall ensure that all the personnel shall have a full medical examination in accordance with accepted medical standard prior to deployment. In Case of any medical emergency/treatment of CONTRACTOR personnel, the CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for their treatment i.e. all such treatment cost has to be borne by the CONTRACTOR.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL:

A. CONTRACTOR shall provide competent personnel, as appropriate, to ensure trouble free operation on round the clock basis.

B. All the crew so deployed has to be fully experienced to deal with operation and maintenance of SRP surface unit, Electrical power supply unit and well operation.

C. The operators shall be responsible for all safety measures to be observed. The operator shall be able to attend all major/minor failures for maintenance jobs related to the mobile SRP unit(s) own his own cost.

D. The responsibilities of the CONTRACTOR Personnel defined herewith are of indicative nature only. COMPANY reserves the right to render additional responsibilities pertaining to his expert domain for the interest of Trouble free operation.

E. All safety gears requires for operation of the units including coverall, safety shoes, helmet, hand gloves, eye gear, safety belt etc have to be provided by the bidder.

F. Non Compliances of safety guidelines will result in deduction of standby charges(Rental Charges) on pro-rata basis.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1.0 Payment Terms:

1.1 Advance payment shall not be made by Company to the Contractor against this contract. Company shall release payment to the Contractor as per the following schedule after deducting income tax and liquidated damages etc., as applicable, within 30(thirty) days from the date of receipt of undisputed invoices.

(a) Company shall pay the due amount on monthly basis against the invoices.

1.2 All payments due to the Contractor shall be made at Contractor's designated bank through RTGS or e-payment mode. Bank charges, if any, shall be to the Contractor's account.

1.3 Payment of any invoice shall not prejudice the right of Company to question the validity of any charges therein provided Company within one year after the date of receipt of any such invoice, shall make and deliver to Contractor written notice of objection to any item or items, the validity of which the Company questions.

2.0 Invoicing Procedure:

2.1 Contractor shall submit four sets of invoice(s) to the Head-Production at its office at OILHOUSE, Jodhpur for processing of payment duly highlighting the Tax components and their bank particulars.

2.2 Company shall within 30(thirty) days of receipt of invoice (s) notify the Contractor of any item (s) under dispute, specifying the reasons thereof, in which event, payment of the disputed amount may be withheld until settlement of the dispute, but payment shall be made of any undisputed portion on or before the due date. This will not prejudice the Company's right to question the validity of the charges at a later date as envisaged in clause No. 1.3.

2.3 Income Tax will be deducted at source from the invoice(s) at the applicable rates as per Indian Law.

2.4 In case the unit is shutdown for more than 6 hours because of breakdown of the unit or power supply, OIL will impose a penalty of INR 8000/- per day. No stand by charges will be paid for that period. Below 6 hours, bidder will be paid standby rate on pro rata basis deducting the shutdown period.

2.5 Contractor shall maintain complete and correct records of all information on which Contractor's invoices are based on for two years from the date of invoice. Such records shall be required for making appropriate adjustment or payments by either party in case of subsequent audit query/objection.

2.6 Installation of the Surface unit will be done by contractor. All the equipments / tools including crane and trailer required for the job will be arranged by contractor on own his cost. If OIL provides the crane service for the same actual cost of the crane charges as per the existing rates of the crane contract will be recovered from the invoice of the contractor.

3.0 Insurance: Contractor must cover all their equipment and manpower with adequate insurance coverage as deemed fit. Company will not assume any responsibility whatsoever in the event of any eventuality to the Contractor's resources during job execution against the contract. Company reserve the right to demand a copy of such insurance coverage/policy for record.

4.0 Liquidated Damages: The Contractor shall be liable to pay liquidated damages at the rate of 0.5% per week or part thereof on the total evaluated contract value for the delay in mobilization, subject to maximum of 7.5%.

(A) **PRICE SCHEDULE DETAILS:** Bidder must quote their rates strictly as per Price Bid Format provided vide Proforma-B considering the following stipulations.

1.0 MOBILIZATION CHARGES (Lump-sum charge per call out):

1.1 Mobilization charge shall be payable on LUMP SUM basis which covers all local and foreign costs (if any) of the Service Provider to Mobilize Manpower and equipment with all supporting provisions to the designated worksite to perform all the intended services as mentioned under SECTION IV of the tender document.

Mobilization charge shall also include Installation of equipments.

6.0 INTER LOCATION MOVEMENT (Per Km. beyond 20 Km)

Additional cost per km basis shall be paid in the event of Mobilization of Manpower and equipment with all supporting provisions from one well to another, beyond 20 km.

7.0 ZERO RATE

No Charges shall be paid for the reason, mentioned hereunder, leading to loss of production.

- (i) Non availability of Manpower.
- (ii) Malfunctioning/Shutdown of Surface-unit and not been able to bring back into operation within 4 hrs. Zero Rate shall be applicable after 4 Hrs. till the surface unit bring back to operation.

INTEGRITY PACT

Between

Oil India Limited (OIL) hereinafter referred to as "The Principal"

And

(Name of the bidder).....hereinafter referred to as "The Bidder/Contractor"

Preamble:

The Principal intends to award, under laid down organizational procedures, contract/s for..... The Principal values full compliance with all relevant laws and regulations, and the principles of economic use of resources, and of fairness and transparency in its relations with its Bidder/s and Contractor/s.

In order to achieve these goals, the Principal cooperates with the renowned international Non-Governmental Organization "Transparency International" (TI). Following TI's national and international experience, the Principal will appoint an external independent Monitor who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

Section: 1 -Commitments of the Principal

(1) The Principal commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles:

1. No employee of the Principal, personally or through family members, will in connection with the tender for, or the execution of a contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for him/herself or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which he/she is not legally entitled to.
2. The Principal will, during the tender process treat all Bidders with equity and reason. The Principal will in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to all Bidders the same information and will not provide to any Bidder confidential/additional information through which the Bidder could obtain an advantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.
3. The Principal will exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.

(2) If the Principal obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees which is a criminal offence under the relevant Anti-Corruption Laws of India, or if there be a Page 2 of 6 substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform its Vigilance Office and in addition can initiate disciplinary actions.

Section: 2 -Commitments of the Bidder/Contractor

(1) The Bidder/Contractor commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption. He commits himself to observe the following principles during his participation in the tender process and during the contract execution.

1. The Bidder/Contractor will not, directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise or give to any of the Principal's employees involved in the tender process or the execution of the contract or to any third person any material or immaterial benefit which he/she is not legally entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the tender process or during the execution of the contract.

2. The Bidder/Contractor will not enter with other Bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, Subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process.

3. The Bidder/Contractor will not commit any offence under the relevant Anticorruption Laws of India; further the Bidder/Contractor will not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Principal as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.

4. The Bidder/Contractor will, when presenting his bid, disclose any and all payments he has made, is committed to or intends to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.

(2) The Bidder/Contractor will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to such offences.

(3) The Bidder/Contractor signing Integrity Pact shall not approach the Courts while representing the matters to IEMs and he/she will await their decision in the matter.

Section 3 -Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future Contracts

If the Bidder, before contract award has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2 or in any other form such as to put his reliability or risibility as Bidder into question, the Principal is entitled to disqualify the Bidder from the tender process or to terminate the contract, if already signed, for such reason.

1. If the Bidder/Contractor has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2 such as to put his reliability or credibility into

question, the Principal is entitled also to exclude the Bidder/Contractor from future contract award processes. The imposition and duration of the exclusion will be determined by the severity of the transgression. The severity will be determined by the circumstances of the case, in particular the number of transgressions, the position of the transgressions within the company hierarchy of the Bidder and the amount of the damage. The exclusion will be imposed for a minimum of 6 months and maximum of 3 years.

2. The Bidder accepts and undertakes to respect and uphold the Principal's Absolute right to resort to and impose such exclusion and further accepts and undertakes not to challenge or question such exclusion on any ground, including the lack of any hearing before the decision to resort to such exclusion is taken. This undertaking is given freely and after obtaining independent legal advice.

3. If the Bidder/Contractor can prove that he has restored/recouped the Damage caused by him and has installed a suitable corruption prevention system, the Principal may revoke the exclusion prematurely.

4. A transgression is considered to have occurred if in light of available evidence no reasonable doubt is possible.

5. Integrity Pact, in respect of a particular contract, shall be operative from the date Integrity Pact is signed by both the parties till the final completion of the contract **or as mentioned in Section 9- Pact Duration whichever is later**. Any violation of the same would entail disqualification of the bidders and exclusion from future business dealings

Section 4 -Compensation for Damages

1. If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder from the tender process prior to the award according to Section 3, the Principal is entitled to demand and recover from the Bidder liquidated damages equivalent to Earnest Money Deposit / Bid Security.

(2) If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or if the Principal is entitled to terminate the contract according to Section 3, the principal shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages equivalent to Security Deposit / Performance Bank Guarantee.

3. The bidder agrees and undertakes to pay the said amounts without protest or demur subject only to condition that if the Bidder/Contractor can prove and establish that the exclusion of the Bidder from the tender process or the termination of the contract after the contract award has caused no damage or less damage than the amount or the liquidated damages, the Bidder/Contractor shall compensate the Principal only to the extent of the damage in the amount proved.

Section 5 -Previous transgression

1. The Bidder declares that no previous transgression occurred in the last 3 years with any other Company in any country conforming to the TI approach or with any other Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process.
2. If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason.

Section: 6 -Equal treatment of all Bidders/Contractor/Subcontractors

1. The Principal will enter into Pacts on identical terms with all bidders and contractors.
2. The Bidder / Contractor undertake(s) to procure from all subcontractors a commitment in conformity with this Integrity Pact. The Bidder/Contractor shall be responsible for any violation(s) of the provisions laid down in this agreement/Pact by any of its sub-contractors/sub-vendors.
3. The Principal will disqualify from the tender process all bidders who do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions.

Section: 7 -Criminal charges against violating Bidders/Contractors/ Subcontractors

If the Principal obtains knowledge of conduct of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, or of an employee or a representative or an associate of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, which constitutes corruption, or if the Principal has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the Vigilance Office.

Section: 8 -External Independent Monitor/Monitors

1. The Principal appoints competent and credible external independent Monitor for this Pact. The task of the Monitor is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this agreement.
2. The Monitor is not subject to instructions by the representatives of the parties and performs his functions neutrally and independently. He reports to the Chairperson of the Board of the Principal.
3. The Contractor accepts that the Monitor has the right to access without restriction to all Field documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Contractor. The Contractor will also grant the Monitor, upon his request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to his project documentation. The same is applicable to Subcontractors. The Monitor is under contractual obligation to treat the information and documents of the Bidder/Contractor/Subcontractor with confidentiality.

4. The Principal will provide to the Monitor sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the Project provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Principal and the Contractor. The parties offer to the Monitor the option to participate in such meetings.

5. As soon as the Monitor notices, or believes to notice, a violation of this agreement, he will so inform the Management of the Principal and request the Management to discontinue or heal the violation, or to take other relevant action. The monitor can in this regard submit non-binding recommendations. Beyond this, the Monitor has no right to demand from the parties that they act in a specific manner, refrain from action or tolerate action. However, the Independent External Monitor shall give an opportunity to the bidder / contractor to present its case before making its recommendations to the Principal.

6. The Monitor will submit a written report to the Chairperson of the Board of the Principal within 8 to 10 weeks from the date of reference or intimation to him by the 'Principal' and, should the occasion arise, submit proposals for correcting problematic situations.

7. If the Monitor has reported to the Chairperson of the Board a Substantiated suspicion of an offence under relevant Anti-Corruption Laws of India, and the Chairperson has not, within reasonable time, taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Vigilance Office, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner, Government of India.

8. The word 'Monitor' would include both singular and plural.

Section:9 -Pact Duration

This Pact begins when both parties have legally signed it. It expires for the Contractor 12 months after the last payment under the respective contract, and for all other Bidders 6 months after the contract has been awarded.

If any claim is made/ lodged during this time, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this pact as specified above, unless it is discharged/determined by Chairperson of the Principal.

Section:10 -Other provisions

1. This agreement is subject to Indian Law. Place of performance and jurisdiction is the Registered Office of the Principal, i.e. New Delhi. The Arbitration clause provided in the main tender document / contract shall not be applicable for any issue / dispute arising under Integrity Pact.

2. Changes and supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing. Side agreements have not been made.

3. If the Contractor is a partnership or a consortium, this agreement must be, signed by all partners or consortium members.

4. Should one or several provisions of this agreement turn out to be invalid, the remainder of this agreement remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.

All the safety gears mentioned above are to be provided to the working personnel before commencement of the work.

3.0 The Contractor shall prepare written Safe Operating Procedure (SOP) for the work to be carried out, including as assessment of risk, wherever possible and safe methods to deal with it/them. The SOP should clearly state the risk arising to men, machineries and materials from the mining operation/operations to be done by the Contractor and how it is to be managed.

4.0 The Contractor shall provide a copy of SOP to the person designated the Mine Owner who shall be supervising the Contractor's work.

5.0 Keep an up to date SOP and provide a copy to changes to a person designed by the Mine Owner/Agent/Manager

6.0 The Contractor has to ensure that all work is carried out in accordance with the Statute and SOP and for the purpose he may deploy adequate qualified and competent personnel for the purpose of carrying out the job in a safe manner. For work of a specified scope/nature, he should develop and provide to the Mine Owner a site

7.0 All persons deployed by the Contractor for working in mine must undergo Mines Vocational Training, initial medical examination, PME. They should be issued cards stating the name of the Contractor and the work and its validity period, indicating status of MVT, IME & PME.

8.0 The Contractor shall submit to DGMS indicating – name of his firm Registration Number, name & Address of person heading the firm, nature of work, type of deployment of work persons, No. of work persons deployed, how many work persons hold VT Certificate, how many work persons undergone IME and type of medical coverage given to the work persons.

9.0 The return shall be submitted quarterly (by 10th of April, July, October & January) for contracts of more than one year. However, for contracts of less than one year, returns shall be submitted monthly.

10.0 It will be entirely the responsibility of the Contractor/ his Supervisor/Representative to ensure strict adherence to all HSE measures and statutory rules during operation in Oil's installations and safety of workers engaged by him. The crew members will not refuse to follow any instruction given by the Company's Installation Manager/Safety Officer/Engineer/Official/Supervisor/Junior Engineer for safe operation.

11.0 Any compensation arising out of the job carried out by the Contractor whether related to pollution, Safety or Health will be paid by the Contractor only.

12.0 Any compensation arising due to accident of the Contractor's personnel while carrying out the job, will be payable by the Contractor.

13.0 The Contractor shall have to report all incidents including near miss to installation manager/Departmental Representative of concerned department of OIL.

14.0 The Contractor has to keep a register of the persons employed by him/her. The Contractor's supervisor shall take and main attendance of his men every day for the work, punctuality.

15.0 If the Company arranges any safety class/training for the working personnel at site (Company employees, Contractor worker etc.) the Contractor will not have any objection to any such training.

16.0 The health check up of Contractor's personnel is to be done by the Contractor in authorized Health Centres as per Oil's requirement & proof of such test(s) is to be submitted to OIL. The frequency of periodic medical examinations

should be every five years for the employees below 45 years of age and every three years for employees of 45 years of age and above.

17.0 To arrange daily tool box meeting and regular site safety meeting and maintain records.

18.0 Records of daily attendance, accident report etc. are to be maintained in Form B,E,J (as per Mines Rules 1955) by the Contractor

19.0 A Contractor employee must, while at work, take reasonable care for the health and safety of people who are all the employee's place of work and who may be affected by the employee's act or omissions at work.

20.0 A Contractor employee must, while at work, co-operate with his or her employer or other persons so far as is necessary to enable compliance with any requirement under the act or the regulations that is imposed in the interest of health, safety and welfare of the employee or any other person.

21.0 Contractor's arrangements for health for health and safety management shall be consistent with those for the mine owner.

22.0 In case Contractor is found non-compliant of HSE laws as required the Company will have the right for directing the Contractor to take action comply with the requirements, and for further non-compliance, the Contractor

23.0 When there is a significant risk to health, environment or safety of a persons or pace arising because of a non-compliance of HSE measure the Company will have the right to direct the Contractor to cease work until the non-compliance is corrected.

24.0 The Contractor should prevent the frequent change of his contractual employees as far as practicable.

25.0 The Contractor should frame a mutually agreed bridging document between OIL and the Contractor with roles and responsibilities clearly defined.

26.0 For any HSE matters not specified in the Contract document, the Contractor will abide the relevant and prevailing Acts/Rules/Regulations pertaining to Health, Safety and Environment.

Procedure for obtaining Labour License under Contract Labour (R&A) Act, 1970 & Central Rules-1971

Every Contractor to whom this Act applies shall execute any work through Contract Labour only after obtaining valid license from Licensing Officer. To obtain license contractor is required to submit:

- i) Application in Form IV in triplicate duly filled (Name of the Proprietor/Partner or the Directors/Responsible person in case of firm/company, complete postal address including Pin Code number, Telephone Number, Fax Number & E-mail address, if any), correct details of PE and work to be executed etc. correctly against all columns;
- ii) In case contractor is registered under the Companies Act and applicant is other than Director then he should be holding valid Power of Attorney.
- iii) Original Form-V issued by PE
- iv) Demand Draft for license fees and security deposit payable in favour of Regional Labour Commissioner (Central), Ajmer along with duly filled central challan (in TR-6) duly signed by applicant in quadruplicate for each demand draft;
- v) Copy of Work Order;
- vi) Copy of Partnership Deed and in case of Company, the application should be accompanied with Memorandum of Association/Article of Association;

Note: 1. Application form complete in all respect shall be either personally delivered to the Licensing Officer or can be sent by Registered A.D. Post.

2. Contractors, may intimate Dy. Chief Labour Commissioner (Central), Ajmer for expediting/suitable action if they do not receive license nor any communication within a week.

3. Contractors are not required to visit office of Licensing Officer unnecessarily for obtaining license until and unless they have been specifically advised to appear in person. Appearance of contractors in the office of licensing officer for obtaining license by persuasion will be viewed seriously.

ANNEXURE -X

Provisions for procurement of Services pertaining to Oil & Gas business activities covered under Purchase preference Policy (linked with Local Content) (PP-LC).

This tender will be governed by the Purchase preference policy (linked with Local Content) (PP-LC) of Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas, Government of India. Indian Bidders are advised to refer notification no. O-27011/44/2016-ONG-II/FP dtd. 25.04.2017 and subsequent amendments, if any, and submit the necessary documents, declaration, undertaking etc. as per the policy guidelines along with their bid. As per the PP-LC policy, 50% of the tendered quantity would be awarded to the lowest techno-commercially qualified LC (Local Content) manufacturer / supplier which are within the price band of 10% of the L1, subject to matching the L1 price. Bidders seeking Purchase preference (linked with Local Content) (PP-LC) shall be required to meet / exceed the target of Local Content (LC) as per values furnished vide original notification of the policy and subsequent amendments applicable as on the bid closing date. The remaining quantity will be awarded to L1 (i.e. Non-Local Content (NLC) manufacturer / supplier not meeting prescribed LC criteria). In case a bidder is eligible to seek benefits under PP-LC policy as well as Public Procurement Policy for MSEs-Order 2012, then the bidders should categorically seek benefits against only one of the two policies i.e. either PP-LC or MSE policy. If a bidder seeks EMD exemption under the MSE policy, then it shall be considered that the bidder has sought benefit against the MSE policy and this option once exercised cannot be modified subsequently. Evaluation of bids with reference to PP-LC policy shall be done by OIL based on the documents submitted by the bidder. OIL shall not be responsible for any incorrect/incomplete submission of documents by bidder leading to non-compliance to PP-LC policy and denial of benefits under the policy.
